STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO SENATE BILL NO. 3335

Honorable Members Thirty-First Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, Senate Bill No. 3335, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the Civil Air Patrol."

The purpose of this bill is to make an appropriation of \$150,000 to "fund the operational expenses of the Hawaii Wing - Civil Air Patrol."

This bill is objectionable because the appropriation is "to fund operational expenses" but there is no indication how the appropriation is constitutionally valid. Section 4 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, requires that "[n]o grant of public money or property shall be made except pursuant to standards provided by law." The bill does not contain any standards and the Hawaii Wing - Civil Air Patrol is ineligible for a grant under the standards for grants made to private organizations by the Legislature in chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), as there is no record of the Hawaii Wing - Civil Air Patrol having applied to the Legislature for a grant, and it is not incorporated under the laws of the State. Even if the Legislature intended for the Department of Defense to procure the services by contract, it does not appear that any exception to the requirements of chapter 103D, HRS, exist under these circumstances.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 3335 without my approval.

RELATING TO THE CIVIL AIR PATROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for over 2 seventy-five years, the civil air patrol has assisted emergency 3 management agencies throughout the nation with response and 4 recovery efforts during and after a disaster. The civil air 5 patrol is a non-profit organization and an auxiliary of the 6 United States Air Force and its missions include emergency 7 services, aerospace education, and cadet programs. Civil air 8 patrol members are volunteers who serve as pilots, scanners, and 9 ground crew in fulfilling its mission.

10 The legislature further finds that the civil air patrol 11 emergency response and recovery activities have included search 12 and rescue, damage assessments, aerial photography of impacted 13 areas, alerts and notifications, and transportation of supplies. 14 Most recently, the civil air patrol conducted aerial 15 reconnaissance of the State after the severe weather incident in 16 December of 2021. The photographs were instrumental in 17 documenting the damage to roadways on the island of Maui and were included in the State's application for a federal disaster 18 2022-3164 SB3335 CD1 SMA.doc

1 declaration. Similar missions were conducted on the island of
2 Hawaii during the Kilauea volcanic eruptions, and on the island
3 of Kauai during the recent flood events. In situations where
4 the State is threatened by a tsunami, the civil air patrol has
5 been called upon to alert remote areas not serviced by outdoor
6 alert system speakers by using speakers mounted to civil air
7 patrol aircraft.

8 The legislature also finds that the Hawaii wing of the 9 civil air patrol has conducted these activities through funding 10 of operational expenses from the State for years. However, that 11 funding ceased in 2019.


Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to support the operational expenses of the Hawaii wing of the civil air patrol.

15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to fund 18 the operational expenses of the Hawaii wing of the civil air 19 patrol.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of21 defense for the purposes of this Act.
