## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that reports of abuse
- 2 against vulnerable adults continue to rise as Hawaii's
- 3 population ages. Although the department of human services is
- 4 authorized to enter premises without a warrant for purposes of
- 5 investigation of abuse to vulnerable adults, existing law limits
- 6 that right of warrantless entry to only situations where there
- 7 is probable cause to believe that a vulnerable adult will be
- 8 physically injured.
- 9 The legislature further finds that under state law, abuse
- 10 includes not only physical abuse, but also psychological abuse,
- 11 sexual abuse, financial exploitation, caregiver neglect, or
- 12 self-neglect. All of these forms of abuse can result in
- 13 damaging losses to the vulnerable adult's mental health,
- 14 welfare, and financial stability. Additionally, vulnerable
- 15 adults may suffer multiple forms of abuse in combination.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to broaden the department of
- 17 human services' right of entry into a vulnerable adult's

- 1 premises without a warrant for an investigation of caregiver
- 2 neglect, self-neglect, or physical abuse.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 346-229, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to amend subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 5 "(b) Any employee of the department engaged in an
- 6 investigation under this part, having probable cause to believe
- 7 that a vulnerable adult will be [physically] injured through
- 8 [abuse] caregiver neglect, self-neglect, or by physical abuse
- 9 before a court order for entry can be obtained, without a
- 10 warrant, may enter upon the premises where the vulnerable adult
- 11 may be found for the purpose of ascertaining that person's
- 12 welfare. Where a warrantless entry is authorized under this
- 13 section, the employee of the department may request the
- 14 assistance of a police officer to gain entrance."
- 15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
