H.B. NO 1625

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION SPECIAL FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the crime victim SECTION 1. 2 compensation commission is struggling financially due to failure 3 of judges to order the crime victim compensation fee in eligible 4 cases and court closures resulting from the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. The crime victim compensation fee was 5 6 created by the legislature in 1998 to act as the primary funding 7 source of the crime victim compensation commission. Collection 8 shortfalls of the crime victim compensation fee over many years have effectively deprived the crime victim compensation 9 10 commission of the funding reserve it needed to survive the 11 COVID-19 pandemic and pandemic-related court closures. These 12 funding shortfalls so limited the crime victim compensation 13 commission's funding reserve that the crime victim compensation 14 commission was in danger of closing had the legislature not 15 provided an emergency infusion of funding last year. Despite 16 this emergency funding, revenue from the crime victim 17 compensation fee continues to decline, falling during the first

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1	half of fiscal year 2022 and is eight per cent lower than
2	revenue for the same period from fiscal year 2021.
3	The purpose of this Act is to address current funding
4	shortfalls experienced by the crime victim compensation
5	commission by exempting the crime victim compensation special
6	fund from certain assessments made by the director of finance to
7	administer special funds.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022;
provided that the amendments made to sections 36-27(a) and
36-30(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, in sections 1 and 2 of this
Act, shall not be repealed when those sections are reenacted on
June 30, 2024, pursuant to section 8 of Act 38, Session Laws of
Hawaii 2021, and sections 7 and 8 of Act 24, Session Laws of
Hawaii 2021.
