A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that families in Hawaii

 have been negatively affected by the coronavirus disease 2019

 (COVID-19) pandemic and has been incredibly disruptive to

 student learning. Students had to transition to online

 learning, which led to some families having to stay at home or
- 3 rearning, which red to some ramifies having to stay at home or
- $oldsymbol{6}$ cut their work hours to watch their child. This was further
- 7 exacerbated due to Hawaii being one of the last states to return
- $oldsymbol{8}$ students back for in-person learning. With a significant number
- ${f 9}$ of students still at home due to quarantine and isolation
- 10 protocols, families continue to serve as caretakers and
- 11 educators.
- 12 The legislature further finds that many residents living
- 13 with at least one child under the age of eighteen have seen
- 14 their combined household income decline and require financial
- 15 assistance to support their child's educational career. The
- 16 legislature believes that the State must provide such assistance

- 1 in order to ensure Hawaii's students continue to learn in the
- 2 best environment possible.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 4 department of education to establish and administer the strong
- 5 students grant pilot program.
- 6 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this Act:
- 7 "Assessment" means an examination or other objective
- 8 evaluation of a student's academic performance, academic
- 9 engagement, or college or career readiness.
- 10 "Contractor" means an individual or entity with whom the
- 11 department enters into a contract for the purpose of performing
- 12 a program function.
- "Department" means the department of education.
- "Eligible education expenses" means:
- 15 (1) Computer hardware, internet access, or other
- 16 technological devices or services that are primarily
- used to meet a participant's educational needs;
- 18 (2) Textbooks, curriculum, or other instructional
- 19 materials, including educational software and
- 20 applications;

1	(3)	Fees for national standardized assessments, advanced
2		placement examinations, examinations related to
3		college or university admissions, or industry-
4		recognized certification examinations;
5	(4)	Therapies including but not limited to occupational,
6		behavioral, physical, speech-language, and audiology
7		therapies, or other services or therapies specifically
8		approved by the department; and
9	(5)	Supplemental education services.
10	"Eligible student" means a student attending a public	
11	school in	grades kindergarten through twelve.
12	"Gra	nt" means an award of \$1,000 to be used for eligible
13	education expenses.	
14	"Gra	nt distribution platform" means a device through which
15	grant funds are transferred from the department to the parents	
16	of participants.	
17	"Parent" means a parent or legal guardian of an eligible	
18	student or a participant.	
19	"Participant" means an eligible student for whom a grant i	
20	awarded under the program.	

"Program" means the strong students grant pilot program.

4	SECT	ION 3. (a) No later than , the department
5	shall est	ablish and administer the strong students grant pilot
6	program t	o provide grants for eligible education expenses to
7	eligible	students who qualify for a grant under the program.
8	(b)	To administer the program, the department shall:
9	(1)	Establish a grant application process for parents of
10		eligible students who apply for the program;
11	(2)	Select a third party to build a grant distribution
12		platform;
13	(3)	Administer or select a third party to administer the
14		grant distribution platform; and
15	(4)	Subject to appropriation, award grants to qualified
16		students under this Act.
17	(c)	The department may:
18	(1)	Retain other contractors as necessary to administer
19		the program and delegate program functions to the
20		contractors; and

1	(2)	Take other actions as necessary to establish,
2		administer, and enforce the provisions of this Act.
3	(d)	The awarding of grants shall be made to eligible
4	students	in the following order of preference and shall be
5	continger	nt on department of taxation verification of the tax
6	informati	ion submitted by the parent:
7	(1)	Eligible students whose families have an adjusted
8		gross income of \$50,000 or less;
9	(2)	Starting on September 15 of each calendar year,
10		eligible students whose families have an annual gross
11		income of \$75,000 or less; and
12	(3)	Starting on November 1 of each calendar year, to all
13		other eligible students on a first come, first served
14		basis until all available program funds are awarded;
15	provided	that applications for program grants shall not be
16	accepted	after December 1 of each calendar year.
17	(e)	Notification of grant awards for eligible students
18	under sub	osection (d)(1) shall be made within thirty days from
19	the depar	stment's receipt of the application from the parent of

20 the eligible student. Grant funds under subsection (d)(1) shall

- 1 be made available for participants' use as soon as practicable
- 2 but no more thirty days after notification of the grant award.
- 3 (f) Prior to the award of a grant, the parent of a
- 4 participant shall agree to verify compliance with the program
- 5 requirements.
- 6 (g) If a parent of a participant is found to misuse grant
- 7 funds, then neither the parent nor another parent of the
- 8 participant living in the same household may apply for any
- 9 future program grants; provided that a parent may appeal the
- 10 finding of misuse to the department.
- 11 (h) Grant funds under the program shall be expended in the
- 12 fiscal year in which the funds are awarded and shall only be
- 13 used for eligible education expenses. Any unused funds at the
- 14 end of a fiscal year shall revert to the general fund.
- 15 SECTION 4. (a) The department shall submit a report to
- 16 the legislature on its efforts to establish the strong students
- 17 grant pilot program established by this Act, including any
- 18 findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to
- 19 the convening of the regular session of 2023.
- 20 (b) The department shall submit a report to the
- 21 legislature on its efforts to implement the strong students

- 1 grant pilot program established by this Act, including any
- 2 findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to
- 3 the convening of the regular session of 2024.
- 4 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 7 establishing and administering the strong students grant pilot
- 8 program established by this Act.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2051.
