A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A WHISTLEBLOWER HOTLINE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 96, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "\$96- Whistleblower hotline. (a) The ombudsman shall 5 establish and manage a hotline by which an employee, or a person acting on behalf of an employee, may contact the office of the 6 7 ombudsman directly to report a violation or suspected violation 8 of: 9 (1) A law, rule, ordinance, or regulation, adopted 10 pursuant to the laws of this State, a political 11 subdivision of this State, or the United States; or 12 (2) A contract executed by the State, a political 13 subdivision of the State, or the United States. 14 The ombudsman shall publicize the availability of the 15 whistleblower hotline. 16 (c) For purposes of this section, "employee" has the same 17 meaning as in section 378-61."

3	''§96- 4	Procedure. The ombudsman may establish procedures	
4	for receivi	ng and processing complaints[7] and whistleblower

7	other actions deemed necessary to address complaints or		
8	whistleblower reports. However, the ombudsman may not levy fees		
9	for the submission or investigation of complaints $[+]$ or		
10	whistleblower reports."		
11	SECTION 3. Section 96-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§96−5	Jurisdiction. The ombudsman has jurisdiction to	
14	[investigate]:

3	SECTION 4. Section 96-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as		
5	follows:		
6	"§96-6 Investigation of complaints[-] and reports. (a)		
7	The ombudsman may investigate any complaint [which] or		
8	whistleblower report of a violation or suspected violation that		
9	the ombudsman determines to be an appropriate subject for		
10	investigation under section 96-8."		
11	SECTION 5. Section 96-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§96-8 Appropriate subjects for investigation. An		
14	appropriate subject for investigation is a report received		
15	through the whistleblower hotline or an administrative act of ar		
16	agency which might be:		
17	(1) Contrary to law;		
18	(2) Unreasonable, unfair, oppressive, or unnecessarily		
19	discriminatory, even though in accordance with law;		
20	(3) Based on a mistake of fact;		
21	(4) Based on improper or irrelevant grounds:		

- 1 (5) Unaccompanied by an adequate statement of reasons;
- 2 (6) Performed in an inefficient manner; or
- 3 (7) Otherwise erroneous.
- 4 The ombudsman may investigate to find an appropriate
- 5 remedy."
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 96-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "§96-9 Investigation procedures. (a) In an
- 9 investigation, the ombudsman may make inquiries and obtain
- 10 information as the ombudsman thinks fit, enter without notice to
- 11 inspect the premises of an agency, and hold private hearings.
- 12 (b) The ombudsman is required to maintain secrecy in
- 13 respect to all matters and the identities of the complainants,
- 14 whistleblowers, or witnesses coming before the ombudsman except
- 15 so far as disclosures may be necessary to enable the ombudsman
- 16 to carry out the ombudsman's duties and to support the
- 17 ombudsman's recommendations."
- 18 SECTION 7. Section 378-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending the definition of "public body" to read as
- 20 follows:
- ""Public body" means:

1	(1)	A state officer, employee, agency, department,
2		division, bureau, board, commission, committee,
3		council, authority, or other body in the executive
4		branch of state government;
5	(2)	An agency, board, commission, committee, council,
6		member, cmbudsman , or employee of the legislative
7		branch of the state government;
8	(3)	A county, city, intercounty, intercity, or regional
9		governing body, a council, special district, or
10		municipal corporation, or a board, department,
11		commission, committee, council, agency, or any member
12		or employee thereof;
13	(4)	Any other body which is created by state or local
14		authority or which is primarily funded by or through
15		state or local authority, or any member or employee of
16		that body;
17	(5)	A law enforcement agency or any member or employee of
18		a law enforcement agency; or
19	(6)	The judiciary and any member or employee of the
20		iudiciary "
