A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that transforming
- 2 Hawaii's surface transportation systems and infrastructure to
- 3 prioritize walking, rolling, bicycling, and public transit is at
- 4 the nexus of the State's commitments to public health, public
- 5 safety, economic vitality, and environmental sustainability.
- 6 The most important component of this transformation is ensuring
- 7 that every child in Hawaii enjoys the infrastructure, social
- 8 support, confidence, and skills to walk, roll, bike, or bus to
- 9 school. The legislature further finds that ensuring safe routes
- 10 to school for every keiki will not only protect our most
- 11 vulnerable road users, but also serve as a long-term investment
- 12 in the future of transportation in the State. However, the
- 13 legislature recognizes that decades of automobile-centric
- 14 planning and development have created formidable barriers to
- 15 this transformation. These barriers include a lack of complete,
- 16 safe, and comfortable bike and pedestrian networks; burdensome
- 17 and complicated funding mechanisms for safe routes to school



- 1 programs and community engagement; a lack of a state safe routes
- 2 to school plan that creates performance measures, goals,
- 3 strategies, and accountability; and a lack of coordination of
- 4 safe routes to school promotion among state and county agencies
- 5 and community-based organizations.
- 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 7 (1) Establish the safe routes to school advisory committee
- 8 to develop a comprehensive statewide safe routes to
- 9 school plan to advise the State on strategies to
- ensure that each child in the State is able to safely
- bike, walk, roll, or bus to that child's respective
- school; and
- (2) Appropriate moneys for the department of
- 14 transportation to hire additional staffing, including
- one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) safe routes to
- 16 school program coordinator, and procure facilities and
- equipment necessary to support the safe routes to
- school advisory committee.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 21 designated and to read as follows:



1	" <u>§29</u>	Safe routes to school advisory committee. (a)
2	There is	established within the planning branch of the highways
3	division	of the department of transportation for administrative
4	purposes	a safe routes to school advisory committee to advise
5	the State	on strategies to ensure that each child in the State
6	is able t	o safely bike, walk, roll, or bus to that child's
7	respectiv	e school.
8	(b)	The safe routes to school advisory committee shall
9	develop a	comprehensive statewide safe routes to school plan
10	that shal	l include:
11	(1)	Methods to stabilize the safe routes special fund
12		distribution mechanism;
13	(2)	Recommendations to streamline safe routes to school
14		program funding to facilitate schools and communities'
15		efforts to apply for, and receive, moneys;
16	(3)	Identification of, and recommendations for, funding
17		mechanisms, planning processes, and programming that
18		are inclusive and equitable; and
19	(4)	Recommendations to prioritize safe routes to school
20		programming to serve students attending schools that
21		receive federal funds pursuant to title I of the

1		federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as
2		amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act.
3	<u>(c)</u>	The safe routes to school advisory committee shall:
4	(1)	Make the comprehensive statewide safe routes to school
5		plan developed pursuant to subsection (b) available to
6		the public no later than November 1, 2025; and
7	(2)	Submit a copy of the comprehensive statewide safe
8		routes to school plan developed pursuant to subsection
9		(b), including any proposed legislation, to the
10		legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
11		convening of the regular session of 2026.
12	(d)	The safe routes to school advisory committee shall
13	consist o	f the following members:
14	(1)	The safe routes to school program coordinator;
15	(2)	A representative of the physical activity and
16		nutrition branch of the department of health; and
17	<u>(3)</u>	A representative of the department of education.
18	<u>(e)</u>	The members of the safe routes to school advisory
19	committee	shall elect one of its members to serve as
20	chairpers	on, who shall invite the following individuals to serve
21	as member	s of the advisory committee:

1	(1)	A representative of the Honolulu police department;
2	(2)	A representative of the Kauai police department;
3	(3)	A representative of the Hawaii police department;
4	(4)	A representative of the Maui police department;
5	(5)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
6		for the city and county of Honolulu;
7	(6)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
8		for the county of Kauai;
9	<u>(7)</u>	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
10		for the county of Hawaii;
11	(8)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
12		for the county of Maui;
13	(9)	One representative from each metropolitan planning
14		organization in the State;
15	(10)	A representative of the Papa Ola Lokahi Transportation
16		Equity Working Group;
17	(11)	A representative of Hawaii Bicycling League;
18	(12)	A representative of Hawaii Public Health Institute;
19	(13)	A representative of the Statewide Safe Routes to
20		School Coalition: and

1	(14) Any other individuals that the safe routes to school
2	advisory committee deems appropriate.
3	(f) The term of each member of the safe routes to school
4	advisory committee shall be four years; provided that of the
5	members initially appointed, members shall serve for
6	four years, three members shall serve for three years,
7	members shall serve for two years, and the remaining
8	members shall serve for one year.
9	(g) The safe routes to school advisory committee shall:
10	(1) Meet no less than monthly to review the State's
11	progress in implementing the State's safe routes to
12	school program; and
13	(2) Make recommendations to the department of
14	transportation no less than biannually;
15	provided that the safe routes to school advisory committee may
16	meet and make recommendations to the department of
17	transportation at additional times as a majority of the members
18	of the safe routes to school advisory committee deems necessary.
19	(h) The members of the safe routes to school advisory
20	committee shall serve without compensation but shall be

- 1 reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary
- for the performance of their duties."
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 6 department of transportation to hire additional staffing,
- 7 including one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) safe routes to
- 8 school program coordinator position, and procure any facilities
- 9 and equipment necessary to support the safe routes to school
- 10 advisory committee.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
