
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated or authorized from the
3 sources of funding indicated below to collective bargaining
4 statewide (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary to fund for fiscal biennium 2021-2023 all
6 collective bargaining cost items in the agreement negotiated
7 with the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit
8 (9):

 19 who are excluded from collective bargaining and belong to the
 20 same compensation plans as those officers and employees within
 21 bargaining unit (9):

 13 bargaining unit (9) who is assigned to the Hawaii health systems
 14 corporation:

 2 source of funding indicated below to Hawaii health systems
 3 corporation - corporate office (HTH 210) the following sums or
 4 so much thereof as may be necessary to fund for fiscal biennium
 5 2021-2023 the salary increases and other adjustments authorized
 6 by chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for state officers and
 7 employees who are excluded from collective bargaining, assigned
 8 to the Hawaii health systems corporation, and belong to the same
 9 compensation plans as those officers and employees within
 10 bargaining unit (9):

13 SECTION 12. Funds appropriated or authorized by this part
 14 shall be allotted by the director of finance to the Hawaii
 15 health systems corporation for expenditure in the respective
 16 fiscal year for the purposes of this part.

17 PART VII

18 SECTION 13. Salary increases and cost adjustments provided
 19 in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is
 20 paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds



1 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,
2 from the respective funds.

3 SECTION 14. The fiscal year 2021-2022 appropriations under
4 this Act shall not lapse until the end of fiscal biennium 2021-
5 2023; provided that funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
6 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2023, shall
7 lapse as of that date.

8 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
