RELATING TO FUNDING FOR PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding to part III a new section to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"291- Costs. Beginning July 1, 2022, all costs		
5	associated with the statewide parking program for persons with		
6	disabilities shall be appropriated from the accessible parking		
7	special account established under section 348F"		
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 348F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
10	and to read as follows:		
11	"§348F- Accessible parking special account. (a) The		
12	disability and communication access board shall establish and		
13	administer an accessible parking special account within the		
14	disability and communication access board special fund		
15	established under section 348F-7. The accessible parking		
16	special account shall accept funds pursuant to section 249-31.		
17	All interest earned or accrued on such moneys shall become part		
18	of the special account.		

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1 (b) Moneys in [he the accessible parking special account 2 shall be expended to cover the costs to administer the statewide 3 parking program for persons with disabilities under part III of 4 chapter 291. 5 (c) From each annual motor vehicle registration fee 6 collected pursuant to section 249-31(b), \$1 shall be deposited 7 into the accessible parking special account established under subsection (a)." 8 9 SECTION 3. Section 249-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended as follows: 11 "SECTION-4. Section 291-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§291-31 State registration fee. (a) All vehicles and 14 motor vehicles in the State as defined in section 249-1, 15 including antique motor vehicles, except as otherwise provided **16** in sections 249-4, 249-6, and 249-31.5, shall be subject to a **17** [\$45] \$46 annual vehicle registration fee; provided that 18 electric vehicles and alternative fuel vehicles shall pay an 19 annual vehicle registration surcharge fee of \$50, which shall be 20 assessed and collected beginning with the first registration 21 renewal for every electric vehicle and alternative fuel vehicle 22 and shall be deposited into the state highway fund established

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1	under section 248-8. The fee shall be paid each year together	
2	with all other taxes and fees levied by this chapter on a	
3	staggered basis as established by each county as authorized by	
4	section 286-51, and the state registration for that county shall	
5	likewise be staggered so that the state registration fee is due	
6	and payable at the same time and shall be collected together	
7	with the county fee. The state registration fee shall be deemed	
8	delinquent if not paid with the county registration fee. The	
9	respective counties shall collect this fee together with the	
10	vehicle registration tax collected for the county and shall	
11	transfer the moneys collected under this section to the State.	
12	(b) In addition to the annual vehicle registration	
13	surcharge fee, for each annual motor vehicle registration fee,	
14	the director shall deposit \$40 into the state highway fund	
15	[and], \$5 into the emergency medical services special fund[.],	
16	and \$1 into the accessible parking special account established	
17	pursuant to section 348F"

DEPARTMENT:

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FUNDING FOR PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

PURPOSE:

Establish an accessible parking special account within the disability and communication access board special fund. Increases the state vehicle registration fee by \$1, to be deposited into the accessible parking special account and require all costs associated with the statewide parking program for persons with disabilities to be appropriated from the accessible parking special account beginning July 1, 2023.

MEANS:

Add new section to part III, chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS); add new section to chapter 348F, HRS, and amend section 249-31, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

The parking program for persons with disabilities benefits those who travel in private motor vehicles. The program is funded by an annual appropriation from the general fund. It is not legal to charge a fee for a disability parking permit in order to fund the program, but it is possible to utilize the motor vehicle registration fee as a funding mechanism since there is a nexus between vehicle use and parking. This will allow the Legislature to redirect the current general fund appropriation to other agencies and programs.

Impact on the public: Residents who pay the motor vehicle registration fee will incur a nominal increase in their fee.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The bill requires the counties to collect
the state motor vehicle registration fee and
transmit it to the State. The bill directs
the State to deposit \$1 for every motor
vehicle registration into an accessible
parking special account within the
disability and communication access board
special fund.
