Description:

Amends subsection 329-101(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to require that a dispenser of a controlled substance report the filling of a controlled substance prescription to the State's Electronic Prescription Accountability System in real time, or report "zero" not less than once every seven days if no controlled substances prescriptions are filled.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE ELECTRONIC

PRESCRIPTION ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of the bill is to require: (1) that dispensers of a controlled substance report the filling of controlled substances prescriptions in real time, and (2) that dispensers of a controlled substance report "zero" dispensing if no prescriptions for designated controlled substances are filled,

within every seven-day period.

MEANS:

Amend section 329-101(d), Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

The proposed amendment would aid prescribers and pharmacists by providing information about a patient's controlled substance prescription history in real time, thereby allowing better prescribing and dispensing decisions to be made.

Impact on the public:

The public would generally benefit by the increased provision of accurate and timely prescribing and dispensing decisions by pharmacists and other controlled substances dispensers.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The amendment would assist the Department of Public Safety in determining compliance with the reporting requirements in section 329-101(d), HRS.
