A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RISK AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR FEMALE OFFENDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 353-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 3 "(b) The centers shall:
- 4 (1) Provide orientation, guidance, and technical services;
- (2) Provide social-medical-psychiatric-psychologicaldiagnostic evaluation;
- 7 (3) Conduct internal pretrial risk assessments on adult offenders within three working days of admission to a 9 community correctional center; provided that this 10 paragraph shall not apply to persons subject to county 11 or state detainers or holds, persons detained without 12 bail, persons detained for probation violation, 13 persons facing revocation of bail or supervised 14 release, and persons who have had a pretrial risk 15 assessment completed prior to admission to a community 16 correctional center. For purposes of this paragraph, 17 "pretrial risk assessment" means an objective,
