HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S SCHOOL FOOD SERVICES BRANCH TO ADOPT AN ADDENDUM TO ITS AGREEMENTS FOR 'AINA PONO REQUIRING THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS, SERVICES, OR BOTH FROM FOOD HUBS.

1 WHEREAS, Act 55, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, amended the objectives and priority guidelines of the Hawaii State Planning 2 Act to encourage the purchase and use of Hawaii-grown food and 3 4 food products by residents, businesses, and governmental bodies; 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Department of Education serves over one 8 hundred thousand nutritionally-balanced, affordable meals a day to over eighty-five percent of youth in Hawaii; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's School Food Services 11 Branch supports public schools statewide and ensures that its 12 meal programs comply with federal and state child nutrition 13 14 standards; and 15 WHEREAS, farm-to-school activities can improve students' 16 physical activity, academic performance, school meal 17 participation, preference for fresh fruits and vegetables, and 18 other healthy behaviors, thereby reducing the risk of chronic 19 20 diseases and other health conditions later in life; and 21 22 WHEREAS, farm-to school programs can also increase 23 educational opportunities and promote a school environment filled with nutritious foods: and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, a farm-to-school initiative was established within the Office of the Lieutenant Governor to address the issues of 27 supply, demand, procurement, and consumption of Hawaii-grown 28 foods in state facilities, primarily educational institutions, 29

1 and take reasonable steps to incorporate more agriculture and nutrition education in school curricula; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the farm-to-school initiative was later incorporated into 'Aina Pono Hawai'i State Farm to School ('Aina 5 Pono), which the School Food Services Branch formed to unite the 6 7 initiative with the Branch's health and nutrition education programs, such as 'Aina Pono Harvest of the Month, test kitchens, 8 9 meal programs, menu planning, and school gardens; and 10 11 WHEREAS, 'Aina Pono develops affordable and healthy menus using fresh, local foods for students attending the Kohala 12 School Complex on the Island of Hawaii and, since 2018, Mililani 13 14 High, Mililani Uka Elementary, and Mililani Waena Elementary 15 schools on Oahu; and 16 17 WHEREAS, farmers in Hawaii face many challenges on their 18 way to achieving economic sustainability; and 19 WHEREAS, food hubs provide these small- to mid-sized 20 21 farmers and producers, who are often unable to afford or manage trucks, warehouses, processing space, and storage spaces, with 22 23 facilities for aggregation, storage, processing, distribution, 24 and marketing support; and 25 WHEREAS, supporting local farmers is essential to the 26 27 State's objectives of economic development and greater self-28 reliance; and 29 WHEREAS, by helping local farmers become or remain 30 economically sustainable, food hubs increase local farmers' 31 ability to participate in larger agricultural markets, while 32 33 expanding consumers' access to fresh, locally grown food and 34 value-added products; and 35 WHEREAS, food hubs support Hawaii's rural communities and 36 37 present opportunities for new generations of local farmers to 38 work and live in Hawaii; now, therefore, 39 40 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 41 42 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
