BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103F-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is repealed. 2 ["[\$103F-202] Community council. (a) There is 3 established a community council on purchase of health and human 4 services. The community council shall be comprised of no more 5 than nine voting members, and one non-voting, ex-officio member 6 of the interagency committee on purchase of health or human 7 services designated by the majority of the members of the 8 committee. There shall be a member from each county, except the county of Kalawao, and up to five members interested in health, 10 human services, employment, or the provision of services to 11 children-and youth. 12 (b) Voting-members-shall be appointed by the governor and 13 serve for four years. Each voting member shall serve until the 14 member's successor is appointed. Section 26-34 shall apply 15

PURPOSE:

To abolish the community council on purchase of health and human services.

MEANS:

Repeal section 103F-202, Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Chapter 103F, HRS, was enacted in 1997 to implement a procurement code for health and human services. The community council, established in 1999 under section 103F-202, HRS, provided input and assistance to the State procurement administrator to develop the rules, infrastructure and procedures for procuring health and human services. The community council is an advisory body with no voting rights. The community council was also valuable in assisting the development of the health and human services procurement conferences, held biennially.

Now, more than 20 years later, the focus of health and human service procurements has changed. The rules are well-established, and both providers and purchasing agencies are acclimated to the process.

Unfortunately, the economic downturn after the financial crisis in 2008 caused the cessation of health and human service procurement conferences, and while the economic picture has improved until very recently, lack of resources has precluded

consideration of resuming conferences in the near future.

The last meeting of the council was held on April 22, 2010. Thereafter, lack of quorum and lack of governor-appointed members prevented further meetings per statutory requirements. With the economic downturn at the time, potential members found that they could not spare the time away from their businesses. In a few cases, potential members served on other boards thereby prohibiting them from serving on the community council.

The community council is a select group of governor-appointed providers and may not be representative of the overall health and human service provider community. Chapter 103F, HRS, Purchases of Health and Human Services, is a single, standardized process for state agencies and providers to procure health and human services. It optimizes information sharing, planning, and service delivery efforts. The State procurement office (SPO) believes that State agencies and private providers communicating and working together in a dynamic paradigm, can refine and update procedures for planning, procuring, and contracting health and human services to meet today's needs.
