A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that lands utilized by
- 2 the department of Hawaiian home lands to provide housing for
- 3 native Hawaiians are offered at affordable rates when compared
- 4 to similar housing available in Hawaii. The purpose of this Act
- 5 is to exempt any housing developed by the department of Hawaiian
- 6 home lands from general excise taxes.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 "§237- Exemptions for any housing development for the
- 11 department of Hawaiian home lands. (a) There shall be exempted
- 12 from the measure of the taxes imposed by this chapter, all gross
- 13 proceeds arising from the planning, design, financing, or
- 14 construction of any housing development by the department of
- 15 Hawaiian home lands as provided in this section.
- 16 (b) The exemption shall be approved by the department of
- 17 Hawaiian home lands and shall apply to the gross income derived



1	by any qu	alified person from a newly constructed or a moderately
2	or substa	ntially rehabilitated project that is developed:
3	(1)	Under a government assistance program approved by the
4		department of Hawaiian home lands;
5	(2)	Under the sponsorship of a nonprofit organization
6		providing home rehabilitation or new homes for
7		qualified families in need of decent, low-cost
8		housing;
9	(3)	To provide affordable rental housing where at least
10		fifty per cent of the available units are for
11		households with incomes at or below eighty per cent of
12		the area median family income as determined by the
13		United States Department of Housing and Urban
14		Development; or
15	(4)	By contract or project developer agreement to provide
16		affordable housing through new construction or
17		substantial rehabilitation; provided that:
18		(A) The allowable general excise tax and use tax
19		costs shall apply to contracting only and shall
20		not exceed \$30,000,000 per year in the aggregate

1	for all projects approved and certified by the
2	department of Hawaiian home lands; and
3	(B) At least twenty per cent of the available units
4	are for households with incomes at or below
5	eighty per cent of the area median family income
6	as determined by the United States Department of
7	Housing and Urban Development.
8	(c) The exemption shall apply to housing projects that are
9	covered by a regulatory agreement with the department of
10	Hawaiian home lands to ensure the project's continued compliance
11	with the applicable eligibility requirements in subsection (b),
12	unless exempted by the department of Hawaiian home lands.
13	(d) All claims for exemption under this section shall be
14	filed with and certified by the department of Hawaiian home
15.	lands and forwarded to the department of taxation by the
16	claimant. Any claim for exemption that is filed and approved
17	shall not be considered a subsidy.
18	(e) The department of Hawaiian home lands may establish,
19	revise, charge, and collect a reasonable service fee, as
20	necessary, in connection with its approvals and certifications
21	of the exemption under this section. The fees shall be

1	deposited	into the department of Hawaiian home lands
2	administr	ation account.
3	(f)	For purposes of this section:
4	<u>"Mod</u>	erately rehabilitated" means rehabilitation to upgrade
5	a dwellin	g unit to a decent, safe, and sanitary condition, or to
6	repair or	replace major building systems or components in danger
7	of failur	<u>e.</u>
8	<u>"Sub</u>	stantially rehabilitated":
9	(1)	Means the improvement of a property to a decent, safe,
10		and sanitary condition that requires more than routine
11		or minor repairs or improvements. It may include but
12		shall not be limited to:
13		(A) The gutting and extensive reconstruction of a
14		dwelling unit; or
15		(B) Cosmetic improvements coupled with the curing of
16		a substantial accumulation of deferred
17		maintenance; and
18	(2)	Includes renovation, alteration, or remodeling to
19		convert or adapt structurally sound property to the
20		design and condition required for a specific use, such
21		as conversion of a hotel to housing for elders."

- 1 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
