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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

SECTION 1. Act 119, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021 (Act 119),

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
