A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NEWBORN HEARING SCREENING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that newborn hearing
- 2 screening is mandated by part XXIX, chapter 321, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes, and helps deaf and hard-of-hearing children reach
- 4 their developmental milestones and become language-ready for
- 5 school.
- 6 The legislature also finds that the national standards for
- 7 early hearing detection and intervention recommend a hearing
- 8 screening by age one month, a diagnostic audiologic evaluation
- 9 by age three months, and enrollment in early intervention
- 10 services by age six months. Studies show that deaf and
- 11 hard-of-hearing children who receive early hearing screening and
- 12 appropriate follow-up have better vocabularies, reach language
- 13 and communication milestones, and are language-ready for school.
- 14 The legislature also finds that the department of health
- 15 newborn hearing screening program does not receive diagnostic
- 16 audiologic evaluation results for some newborns who do not pass
- 17 newborn hearing screening. The legislature further finds that

- 1 consistent reporting of diagnostic audiologic evaluation results
- 2 would allow the program to ensure that any infant who does not
- 3 pass a hearing screening would receive a diagnostic audiologic
- 4 evaluation, appropriate follow-up, and support. Timely
- 5 diagnostic audiologic evaluation results would also facilitate
- 6 referrals of deaf and hard-of-hearing infants to early
- 7 intervention services.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that the department of
- 9 health receives timely diagnostic audiologic evaluation results
- 10 on newborns who did not pass newborn hearing screening and
- 11 infants whose hearing status changes.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 321-361, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 14 1. By adding four new definitions to be appropriately
- 15 inserted and to read:
- 16 ""Audiologist" means an individual licensed as an
- 17 audiologist pursuant to chapter 468E.
- 18 "Deaf or hard-of-hearing" means any type and degree of
- 19 permanent hearing loss as assessed by an audiologist or
- 20 physician who is a specialist in hearing function.

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- 1 "Diagnostic audiologic evaluation" means an evaluation of
- 2 the sensitivity of a person's sense of hearing as assessed by an
- 3 audiologist or physician who is a specialist in hearing
- 4 function.
- 5 "Hearing screening" means objective procedures to detect
- 6 possible hearing loss and determine the need for diagnostic
- 7 audiologic evaluation and medical evaluation."
- 8 2. By deleting the definitions of "hearing impaired
- 9 infant", "management", and "screening":
- 10 [""Hearing impaired infant" means an infant who has an
- 11 impairment that is a dysfunction of the auditory system of any
- 12 type or degree sufficient to interfere with the acquisition and
- 13 development of speech and language skills.
- 14 "Management" means the habilitation of the hearing-impaired
- 15 infant.
- 16 "Screening" means a test or battery of tests administered
- 17 to determine the need for a professional examination."]
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 321-362, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "§321-362 Duties. It shall be the duty and responsibility
- 21 of the department to:

1	(1)	Establish, implement, and evaluate a statewide
2		[program for early identification of, and intervention
3		for, hearing impairment in infants;] system for
4		hearing screening and diagnostic audiologic evaluation
5		to identify infants who are deaf or hard-of-hearing,
6		and for referral and enrollment of these infants in
7		early intervention services;
8	(2)	Establish standards and guidelines for [the] hearing
9		screening, identification, diagnosis, intervention,
10		and monitoring of infants [with hearing impairment and
11		infants at risk for delayed onset of hearing
12		impairment;] who are deaf or hard-of-hearing or who
13		have been identified with a risk indicator for
14		developing delayed-onset or progressive hearing loss,
15		or both;
16	(3)	Develop a plan in conjunction with the department of
17		[education's statewide center for students with
18		hearing or visual impairments] education to involve
19		[the] parents or guardians [with the] in any medical
20		and educational follow-up [and management of] for
21		infants who [have been identified as hearing impaired

1		or at risk of delayed onset of hearing impairments;]
2		are deaf or hard-of-hearing, or who have been
3		identified with a risk indicator for developing
4		delayed-onset or progressive hearing loss, or both;
5		and
6	(4)	Collect and analyze program data in relation to the
7		duties and responsibilities of the department."
8	SECT	ION 4. Section 321-362.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"[-]§321-362.5[- Screening for hearing impairment.]	
11	Hearing screening, diagnostic audiologic evaluation, and	
12	intervent	ion. (a) All newborn infants shall [be screened for
13	hearing i	mpairment for early identification of children with
14	hearing l	oss and for the promotion of their development of
15	language	and communication.] receive a hearing screening to
16	allow early identification and intervention to maximize social,	
17	emotional	, and language outcomes for children who are deaf or
18	hard-of-hearing.	
19	(b)	The person in charge of each birthing facility
20	[caring]	for newborn infants and the responsible physician
21	attending	the birth of a newborn or the person assisting the

- 1 birth of a child not attended by a physician shall ensure that
- 2 every infant in the person's care [be screened for hearing]
- 3 impairment.] receives a hearing screening. This section shall
- 4 not apply if the parent, guardian, or other person having
- 5 custody or control of the child objects to the hearing screening
- 6 in writing on the grounds that the hearing screening conflicts
- 7 with [their] the parent's, guardian's, or other person's
- 8 religious beliefs. The written objection shall be made a part
- 9 of the infant's medical record.
- 10 (c) Birthing facilities [screening newborn infants for
- 11 hearing impairment] shall report newborn hearing screening
- 12 results to the department [for the purpose of the department
- 13 ensuring a statewide system for the screening, diagnostic
- 14 evaluation, and intervention for all newborn infants with
- 15 hearing impairment].
- 16 (d) Each audiologist and physician who is a specialist in
- 17 hearing function and who performs diagnostic audiologic
- 18 evaluations of infants shall report to the department the
- 19 diagnostic audiologic evaluation results of any infant up to the
- 20 age of three years who does not pass the hearing screening test
- 21 or is diagnosed as deaf or hard-of-hearing."

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- 1 SECTION 5. Section 321-363, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§321-363 Rules. The department shall adopt rules,
- 4 pursuant to chapter 91, necessary for the purposes of this part,
- 5 including [but not limited to] the administration and quality of
- 6 newborn hearing screening; retention of records and related
- 7 data; reporting of [positive] hearing screening results;
- 8 reporting of diagnostic audiologic evaluation [and] results;
- 9 intervention for infants [with hearing impairment; informing]
- 10 who have been identified as deaf or hard-of-hearing; provision
- 11 of information to parents about the purpose of hearing
- 12 screening[+], diagnostic audiologic evaluation, and
- 13 intervention; and [maintaining] maintenance of the
- 14 confidentiality of affected families."
- 15 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
