A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DISCLOSURE OF VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:
- 2 (1) Enable the department of health to disclose vital
- 3 statistics records for public health purposes; and
- 4 (2) Update the categories of those who are able to access
- 5 otherwise confidential vital statistics records.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 338-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "§338-18 Disclosure of records. (a) To protect the
- 9 integrity of vital statistics records, to ensure their proper
- 10 use, and to ensure the efficient and proper administration of
- 11 the vital statistics system, it shall be unlawful for any person
- 12 to permit inspection of, or to disclose information contained in
- 13 vital statistics records, or to copy or issue a copy of all or
- 14 part of any such record, except as authorized by this part [or
- 15 by] and in a manner consistent with rules adopted by the
- 16 department of health.

1 (b) The department shall not permit inspection of public 2 health statistics records, or issue a certified copy of any such record or part thereof, unless it is satisfied that the 3 applicant has a direct and tangible interest in the record. 4 The 5 following exclusive list of persons and agencies shall be considered to have a direct and tangible interest in a public 6 health statistics record: 7 8 (1)The registrant; 9 The spouse of the registrant; (2) 10 (3) A parent of the registrant; A descendant of the registrant; 11 (4)12 (5) A person having a common ancestor with the registrant; 13 (6) A legal guardian of the registrant; 14 (7) A person or agency acting on behalf of the registrant; 15 A personal representative of the registrant's estate; (8) 16 (9) A person whose right to inspect or obtain a certified 17 copy of the record is established by an order of a 18 court of competent jurisdiction; 19 Adoptive parents who have filed a petition for (10)20 adoption and who need to determine the death of one or

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         (e) (d) The department may permit persons working on
    genealogy projects access to microfilm or other copies of vital
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    records of events that occurred more than seventy-five years
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    prior to the current year.
         [(f) Subject to this section, the department may direct
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    its local agents to make a return upon filing of birth, death,
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    and fetal death certificates with them, of certain data shown to
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    federal, state, territorial, county, or municipal agencies.
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    Payment by these agencies for these services may be made as the
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    department shall direct.

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    lieu of a certified copy of any such record, or any part
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    thereof, unless it is satisfied that the applicant requesting a
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    verification is:
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              A person who has a direct and tangible interest in the
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              record but requests a verification in lieu of a
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              certified copy;

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| | government purpose, maintains and needs to update |

 - (4) A private or government attorney who seeks to confirm information about a vital event relating to any such

| 14 | may disclose public health statistics records to persons who are |
| 15 | employed by department of health programs, acting within the |
| 16 | scope of their employment, who need to use a public health |
| 17 | statistics record for research purposes, as approved by the |
| 18 | department of health's institutional review committee. Upon the |
| 19 | institutional review committee's approval, the department may |
