RELATING TO REPORTS FILED WITH THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) The candidate and treasurer of the candidate
4 committee of each candidate whose name will appear on the ballot
5 shall file preliminary, final, and supplemental reports as
6 follows:

1 (3) The filing date for the final election period report 2 is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent, 3 subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan 4 election. The report shall be current through the day 5 of the applicable election. The final election period 6 report shall be filed by a candidate who is 7 unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial 8 nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to 9 office in the primary, initial special, or initial 10 nonpartisan election; provided that a candidate who is 11 elected and is to be sworn into office [prior to] 12 before thirty calendar days after a general, 13 subsequent, subsequent special, or subsequent 14 nonpartisan election in which the candidate was 15 elected, shall file the final election period report 16 three business days before the date the candidate is 17 to be sworn into office; and 18 The filing dates for supplemental reports are: (4) 19 (A) January 31 annually; and 20 July 31 after an election year. Section 11-339, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (b) and (c) to read as follows: 5 6 "(b) By June 30 of an election year, a candidate committee 7 that does not intend to receive contributions [7 or] and make 8 expenditures $[\tau]$ that aggregate more than \$1,000 in an election 9 period shall notify the commission of its intent in the 10 candidate committee's organizational report. 11 (c) By the fifth calendar day before the due date of the preliminary primary report $[\tau]$ due ten days before the election, 12 13 a noncandidate committee that does not intend to receive 14 contributions [, or] and make expenditures, that aggregate more 15 than \$1,000 in an election period shall notify the commission of 16 its intent in the noncandidate committee's organizational 17 report." 18 SECTION 3. Campaign Spending Commission Package; Committee Reports; Time for Candidates to File Preliminary Reports; Time for Committees to Notify Commission of Intent to Receive and Spend in the Aggregate \$1,000 or Less

Description:

Housekeeping measure that provides that candidates are not required to file preliminary general reports if they are either unsuccessful or are elected to office in the primary election. Amends subsections (b) and (c) of section 11-339, HRS, to make them consistent with subsection (a) by aggregating contributions and expenditures in determining whether a committee need only file the final election period report.
