A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§709- Continuous abuse of a minor under the age of
- 5 sixteen years; requisite number of acts; penalty. (1) A person
- 6 commits the offense of continuous abuse of a minor under the age
- 7 of sixteen years if the person:
- 8 (a) Is a parent or legal guardian of, resides in the same
- 9 home with, or has recurring access to, a minor under
- the age of sixteen years; and
- (b) While the minor is under the age of sixteen years,
- engages in three or more acts resulting in bodily
- injury to the minor over a period of time.
- 14 (2) To convict under this section, the trier of fact, if a
- 15 jury, need unanimously agree only that the requisite number of
- 16 acts have occurred; the jury need not agree on which acts
- 17 constitute the requisite number.

- 1 (3) No other offense involving the same victim that also
- 2 involves abuse of a family or household member under section
- 3 709-906 or any offense involving bodily injury as defined in
- 4 section 707-700, may be charged in the same proceeding with a
- 5 charge under this section, unless the other charged offense
- 6 occurred outside the period of the offense charged under this
- 7 section, or the other offense is charged in the alternative. A
- 8 defendant may be charged with only one count under this section,
- 9 unless more than one victim is involved, in which case a
- 10 separate count may be charged for each victim.
- 11 (4) Continuous abuse of a minor under the age of sixteen
- 12 years is a class C felony."
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 begun before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 18 and upon ratification of a constitutional amendment allowing the
- 19 legislature, in cases involving crimes against minors, to define
- 20 what behavior constitutes a continuing course of conduct, and

- 1 what constitutes the jury unanimity that is required for a
- 2 conviction.
