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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that all state board and  
2       commission members are required to submit financial disclosures  
3       to the state ethics commission. Act 230, Session Laws of Hawaii  
4       2014, required the financial disclosure statements of certain  
5       state board and commission members to be made public. As a  
6       direct result, the state currently has many vacancies to fill  
7       and the pool of qualified individuals that are willing to serve  
8       on state boards and commissions has reduced and continues to  
9       experience reductions.

10       The legislature further finds that community members who  
11       are most qualified to serve are often not willing to pursue a  
12       seat on state boards or commissions because of the requirement  
13       that financial disclosures be made public. Those individuals  
14       and their businesses often value privacy concerning  
15       compensation. The State is at a critical stage across many  
16       issues and it is imperative that it attract and retain strong  
17       leaders to help it move forward. Removing the requirement that



1 financial disclosures be made public should increase the size  
2 and quality of the pool of candidates for seats on state boards  
3 and commissions, which would benefit the people of Hawaii.

4 The purpose of this Act is to require the redaction of  
5 certain information on the financial disclosure statements  
6 deemed to be public records for non-paid volunteer members of  
7 state boards and commissions.

8 SECTION 2. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
9 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

10 "(d) The financial disclosure statements of the following  
11 persons shall be public records and available for inspection and  
12 duplication[+]; provided that all amounts reported pursuant to  
13 subsection (f) by non-paid volunteer members of state boards,  
14 commissions, and agencies listed under paragraph (8) shall be  
15 redacted:

16 (1) The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of  
17 the legislature, candidates for and delegates to the  
18 constitutional convention, the trustees of the office  
19 of Hawaiian affairs, and candidates for state elective  
20 offices;



- 1           (2) The directors of the state departments and their  
2           deputies, regardless of the titles by which the  
3           foregoing persons are designated; provided that with  
4           respect to the department of the attorney general, the  
5           foregoing shall apply only to the attorney general and  
6           the first deputy attorney general;
- 7           (3) The administrative director of the State;
- 8           (4) The president, the vice presidents, the assistant vice  
9           presidents, the chancellors, [~~members of the board of~~  
10          ~~regents,~~] and the provosts of the University of  
11          Hawaii;
- 12          (5) The [~~members of the board of education and the~~  
13          superintendent, the deputy superintendent, the state  
14          librarian, and the deputy state librarian of the  
15          department of education;
- 16          (6) The administrative director and the deputy director of  
17          the courts;
- 18          (7) The administrator and the assistant administrator of  
19          the office of Hawaiian affairs; and
- 20          (8) The members of the following state boards,  
21          commissions, and agencies:



- 1 (A) The board of directors of the agribusiness  
2 development corporation established under section  
3 163D-3;
- 4 (B) The board of agriculture established under  
5 section 26-16;
- 6 (C) The state ethics commission established under  
7 section 84-21;
- 8 (D) The Hawaii community development authority  
9 established under section 206E-3;
- 10 (E) The Hawaiian homes commission established under  
11 the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as  
12 amended, and section 26-17;
- 13 (F) The board of directors of the Hawaii housing  
14 finance and development corporation established  
15 under section 201H-3;
- 16 (G) The board of land and natural resources  
17 established under section 171-4;
- 18 (H) The state land use commission established under  
19 section 205-1;
- 20 (I) The legacy land conservation commission  
21 established under section 173A-2.4;



- 1           (J)   The natural area reserves system commission  
2               established under section 195-6;  
3           (K)   The board of directors of the natural energy  
4               laboratory of Hawaii authority established under  
5               section 227D-2;  
6           (L)   The board of directors of the Hawaii public  
7               housing authority established under section  
8               356D-3;  
9           (M)   The public utilities commission established under  
10              section 269-2;  
11          (N)   The commission on water resource management  
12              established under section 174C-7; [~~and~~]  
13          (O)   The stadium authority established under section  
14              109-1[~~-~~];  
15          (P)   The members of the board of regents of the  
16              University of Hawaii; and  
17          (Q)   The members of the board of education."

18           SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
19   and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

20           SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2023.
