A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 84-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended as follows:

1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted and to read:

"Intern" means any individual:

(1) Who performs unpaid services for the State for or more hours per week as part of an internship program established by a private or public secondary or post-secondary educational institution; or

(2) Who:

(A) Is employed by a private sector employer; and

(B) Has taken an unpaid leave of absence from the private sector employer,

to instead work for the State for a fixed period of time not to exceed days."

2. By amending the definition of "employee" to read:

1 ""Employee" means any nominated, appointed, or elected
2 officer [~~or~~], employee, or intern of the State, including
3 members of boards, commissions, and committees, and employees
4 under contract to the State or of the constitutional convention,
5 but excluding legislators, delegates to the constitutional
6 convention, justices and judges."

7 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
