#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 HOUSING FOR TRANSITION AGED YOUTH
- 5 §356D-Definitions. As used in this part:
- 6 "Current or former foster youth" means youth under twenty-
- 7 six years of age who are currently or were formerly removed from
- 8 their home pursuant to chapter 587A or section 571-48.
- 9 "Eligible activities" includes funding capital development
- 10 programs, such as acquisition, leasing, construction, and
- 11 rehabilitation sites for emergency shelter, transitional
- housing, and permanent supportive housing for transition aged 12
- 13 youth; or capital development loans for the conversion of
- 14 emergency shelter or transitional housing to permanent
- 15 supportive housing for transition aged youth.
- 16 "Eligible organization" means an agency of local government
- 17 or a nonprofit corporation that provides, or contracts with



- 1 community organizations to provide, emergency shelter or
- 2 transitional housing, or both.
- 3 "Homeless youth" means an unaccompanied youth between
- 4 twelve and twenty-four years of age, inclusive, who is
- 5 experiencing homelessness, as defined in subsection (2) of
- 6 Section 725 of the United States McKinney-Vento Homeless
- 7 Assistance Act of 1987.
- 8 "Nonprofit corporation" means a corporate entity that is
- 9 registered with the State and has received a written
- 10 determination from the Internal Revenue Service that it is
- 11 exempt under either section 501(c)(3), section 501(c)(4), or so
- 12 much of section 501(c)(2) as applied to title holding entities
- 13 that turn over their income to organizations that are exempt
- 14 under either section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4), of the Internal
- 15 Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- "Transition aged youth" means current or former foster
- 17 youth, or homeless youth.
- 18 §356D- Transition aged youth housing special fund. (a)
- 19 There is established in the state treasury the transition aged
- 20 youth housing special fund into which shall be deposited
- 21 appropriations made by the legislature to the fund.



1	(b)	Moneys from the transition aged youth housing special									
2	fund shal	l be used for the purpose of creating housing for youth									
3	under twe	nty-six years of age who have been removed from their									
4	homes or	are experiencing homelessness unaccompanied by a parent									
5	or legal guardian.										
6	(c)	A total of up to \$50,000,000 shall be distributed by									
7	the authority for the purposes of this part; provided that:										
8	(1)	The authority makes at least 47.5 per cent of the									
9		funds available to eligible organizations for projects									
10		to house current foster youth between eighteen and									
11		twenty-one years of age, inclusive. If the authority									
12		is unable to comply with this paragraph due to a lack									
13		of applications, it may spend the remaining funds									
14		pursuant to paragraph (2);									
15	(2)	Not more than five per cent of available funds shall									
16		be expended on program administration, including state									
17		operations expenditures and technical assistance; and									
18	(3)	The remaining available funds not subject to paragraph									
19		(1) or (2) are made available to eligible									
20		organizations for eligible activities consistent with									
21		this section.									

- 1 (d) The authority shall disburse grant funds as promptly
- 2 as possible.
- 3 §356D- Grants; loans. (a) The authority shall award
- 4 grants to eligible organizations for the development of housing
- 5 for transition aged youth.
- 6 (b) The authority shall distribute funds for eliqible
- 7 activities as grants in the form of forgivable deferred loans
- 8 (c) Funding shall be made available to each project
- 9 granted to an eligible organization as a loan with a term of
- 10 five years for rehabilitation, seven years for substantial
- 11 rehabilitation, ten years for acquisition and rehabilitation or
- 12 new construction, or twenty years for conversion to permanent
- 13 supportive housing for transition age youth.
- (d) Each deferred loan shall be secured by a deed of trust
- and promissory note.
- 16 (e) Repayment of the loan shall be deferred if the project
- 17 is used as an emergency shelter, permanent supportive housing,
- 18 or transitional housing for transition aged youth.
- 19 (f) The loan shall be forgiven at the completion of the
- 20 specified year term.

- 1 (g) If a transfer or conveyance of the project property
- 2 occurs before the authority forgives the loan, and the transfer
- 3 or conveyance results in the property no longer being an
- 4 emergency shelter, permanent supportive housing, or transitional
- 5 housing for transition aged youth, the authority shall terminate
- 6 the grant and require the repayment of the deferred loan in
- 7 full.
- 8 (h) A project may opt for the authority to not forgive the
- 9 loan.
- 10 §356D- Criteria; evaluation. (a) The authority shall
- 11 develop and set forth the criteria for evaluating applications
- 12 in a notice of funding availability.
- 13 (b) The authority shall award grants to applicants that
- 14 best meet the criteria; provided that no grants made pursuant to
- 15 this chapter shall be awarded for projects, development, or
- 16 other similar activities that take place on ceded lands.
- 17 (c) The authority shall give preference to applications
- 18 from organizations that have experience providing direct
- 19 services to transition aged youth and organizations working in
- 20 partnership with those that provide direct services to
- 21 transition aged youth.

- ${f 3}$  (e) The authority's decision to approve or deny an
- 4 application and the determination of the amount of funding to be
- 5 provided shall be final.
- 6 (f) The authority shall maintain and make available to the
  7 public the following:
- 8 (1) The number of applications for the program funding9 received by the authority;
- 10 (2) The number of applicants for the program funding
  11 denied by the authority;
- 12 (3) The name of each recipient of program funds and any subrecipients; and
- 14 (4) The number of new and converted units created for 15 transition aged youth, by year.
- 16 §356D- Recipients. (a) Grants awarded by the authority
  17 shall be used by the grant recipient to defray costs of eligible
  18 activities.
- (b) Grant awards for projects that have not begun
  construction within twelve months of the award shall be
  terminated and the authority shall reallocate the funds. The

- 1 authority may extend the twelve-month period by an additional
- 2 period of no more than twelve months.
- 3 (c) An applicant that receives funds pursuant to this
- 4 section shall provide the authority with a list of all
- 5 subrecipients.
- 6 Consultation. The authority shall consult with
- 7 the office of youth services on all matters concerning
- 8 transition aged youth."
- 9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general fund
- 10 the sum of \$50,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 11 for fiscal year 2022-2023 to be deposited into the transition
- 12 aged youth housing special fund.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the public
- 14 housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.

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#### Report Title:

Housing; Homelessness; Transition Aged Youth; Housing Fund; Appropriation

#### Description:

Creates the transition aged youth housing special fund to provide homes for youth ages twelve through twenty-six who face homelessness. Appropriates funds.

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
