A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there has been a 2 sharp increase in discrimination against Asians in the United 3 States fueled by a pandemic that has been unreasonably linked to 4 Asians. Amid a rise in anti-Asian sentiment, the legislature 5 finds that the current K-12 school curriculum is inadequate in 6 teaching Asian American history, particularly in teaching the 7 impact of historical discrimination of the United States against 8 Asians such as the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act. Oftentimes, 9 Asian-Americans are held as the "model minority", a mythos that 10 only serves to justify discriminatory practices against other 11 minorities and ignores the countless sacrifices of early Asian 12 immigrants.

The legislature further finds that there are many benefits to teaching the events of Asian American history. Teaching students about the contributions of Asian American communities to the economic, cultural, social, and political development of the United States allows students to feel empowered and to

4	should include a unit about how race shapes power structures and	
5	lived experience to further teach students about their civic	
6	duty.	
7	The	purpose of this Act is to require:
8	(1)	The board of education to include in its curriculum a
9		unit of instruction studying the events of Asian
10		American history;
11	(2)	The superintendent of education to prepare and make
12		available to all school complex areas instructional
13		material that shall be the guidelines for development
14		of the Asian American history education in each
15		school;
16	(3)	The regional superintendent to monitor each school
17		district's compliance with the Asian American history
18		curriculum requirements during their annual compliance
19		visit;



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(4) That each school complex area determine the minimum 1 2 amount of instructional time that qualifies as a unit 3 of instruction in Asian American history; and Asian American history to be taught in all schools 4 (5) 5 commencing with the 2022-2023 school year. 6 SECTION 2. The board of education shall include in its curriculum a unit of instruction studying the events of Asian 7 8 American history. The curriculum shall include the history of 9 Asian Americans in Hawaii; contributions of Asian Americans 10 toward advancing civil rights from the 19th century onward; and 11 contributions of Asian American communities to the economic, 12 cultural, social, and political development of the United 13 States. SECTION 3. (a) The superintendent of education shall 14 15 prepare and make available to all school complex areas 16 instructional material, including but not limited to 17 instructional material established by the Public Broadcasting 18 Service, that shall be the guidelines for development of the 19 Asian American history education in each school.



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The superintendent of education shall monitor each 1 (b) school complex area's compliance with the Asian American history 2 3 curriculum requirements during their annual compliance visit. Each school complex area shall determine 4 SECTION 4. (a) the minimum amount of instructional time that qualifies as a 5 6 unit of instruction in Asian American history. Commencing with the 2022-2023 school year, every 7 (b) public elementary, middle, and high school shall include a unit 8 9 of instruction in Asian American history in their curriculum. 10 Each school may provide this unit of instruction through an online program or course. 11 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 13





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Report Title: Board of Education; Asian American History; Curriculum

Description:

Requires the Board of Education to include in its curriculum a unit of instruction studying the events of Asian American history. Requires the Superintendent of Education to prepare and make available to all school complex areas instructional material that shall be the guidelines for development of the Asian American history education in each school and monitor compliance. Requires that each school complex area determine the minimum amount of instructional time that qualifies as a unit of instruction in Asian American history. Requires Asian American history in be taught in each school commencing the 2022-2023 school year.
