9	(1)	Break up, dig up, disturb, undermine or dig under, or
10		cause to be broken up, dug up, disturbed, undermined,
11		or dug under, the right-of-way of any state highway;

13	(2)	Place, erect, leave, or store any structure, motor or
14		other vehicle, equipment, or any other object wholly
15		or partially within the right-of-way of any state
16		highway; provided that this paragraph shall not apply

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1	to the holding or displaying of movable signs, for the		
2	purpose of carrying on political campaign activities.		
3	(b) Any public utility seeking a permit under this section		
4	shall prioritize maintenance and upkeep to infrastructure in		
5	areas with heavy traffic to minimize disruptions to		
6	transportation."
