A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that voter turnout in the 2 State remains low and continues to decline. In 2016, Hawaii had the lowest voter turnout in the United States. Only 52.7 per 3 4 cent of registered Hawaii voters cast ballots in the 2018 5 general election. This represents a sharp decline in voter 6 turnout over the years, as approximately ninety-four per cent of 7 registered voters cast ballots in the State's first gubernatorial election in 1959. 8

Additionally, the State has a historically low rate of
voter registration. According to a 2016 estimate from the
United States Census Bureau, Hawaii had the lowest percentage of
registered voters in the country at 49.8 per cent, well below
the national average of 64.2 per cent. Therefore, of the
1,064,000 people in Hawaii who were qualified to vote in the
2016 election, 534,128 were not registered to vote.

16 The legislature further finds that voting at a young age 17 creates and empowers life-long voters. Data shows that after an

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1	individua	l votes once, the individual often becomes a habitual
2	voter. T	herefore, by facilitating the ability of those sixteen
3	years of	age and older to preregister or register to vote, the
4	State wil	l be empowering a new generation of lifelong voters.
5	Ассо	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase voter
6	participa	tion and encourage civic engagement in Hawaii's schools
7	by establ	ishing a process for the automatic preregistration and
8	registrat	ion of public school- and charter school-enrolled
9	students	who are at least sixteen years of age.
10	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
11	by adding	a new section to part II to be appropriately
12	designate	d and to read as follows:
13	" <u>§11</u>	- Automatic voter preregistration and registration;
14	opt out.	(a) Beginning January 1, 2023, any person who:
15	(1)	Is enrolled in a public high school or public charter
16		<pre>school;</pre>
17	(2)	Is otherwise qualified to preregister or register to
18		vote under this part;
19	(3)	Is at least sixteen years of age; and
20	(4)	Properly completes and submits a voter registration
21		affidavit,



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1	shall be automatically preregistered or registered to vote as
2	provided in this section.
3	(b) Between January 1 and January 31 of each year, the
4	superintendent of education shall provide and may collect from
5	each public school student who is at least sixteen years of age
6	a voter affidavit containing the information required by section
7	11-15 to allow the student to preregister or register to vote or
8	to opt out of preregistering or registering to vote. The
9	superintendent of education may transmit the voter registration
10	affidavit to the clerk of the county in which the applicant
11	resides; provided that the superintendent of education shall not
12	maintain, scan, review, or copy any voter affidavit nor transmit
13	any information maintained by the department of education.
14	(c) Between January 1 and January 31 of each year, an
15	authorizer, as defined in section 302D-1, shall provide and may
16	collect from each charter school student who is at least sixteen
17	years of age a voter affidavit containing the information
18	required by section 11-15 to allow the student to preregister or
19	register to vote or to opt out of preregistering or registering
20	to vote. The authorizer may transmit the voter registration
21	affidavit to the clerk of the county in which the applicant



1	resides; provided that the authorizer shall not maintain, scan,
2	review, or copy any voter affidavit nor transmit any information
3	maintained by the state public charter school commission.
4	(d) The clerk shall determine whether the applicant is
5	currently preregistered or registered in the general county
6	register."
7	SECTION 3. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding a new section to part II, subpart C, to be
9	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
10	"§302A- Automatic voter preregistration and
