A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the biggest expense
- 2 for any individual or family is housing or shelter. Within the
- 3 last decade, it has become increasingly difficult for
- 4 individuals and families to save for a down payment on a home or
- 5 pay for their mortgage or rent. In 2021, housing markets saw a
- 6 fifteen per cent increase in the cost for single-family homes
- 7 and a thirteen per cent increase in the cost for condominiums
- 8 compared to 2020. The cost of housing in Hawaii has rapidly
- 9 increased, effectively pricing out local renters and homeowners.
- 10 Current real estate trends show there is a need to provide more
- 11 affordable housing.
- 12 The legislature further finds that the rising cost of
- 13 housing in the State may disproportionately affect vulnerable
- 14 populations, such as the elderly, homeless or those struggling
- 15 to find affordable housing. Vulnerable populations may have
- 16 fixed incomes or experience continually rising rents that become
- 17 unmanageable. Safe, affordable housing not only allows

- 1 individuals and families to live and thrive in Hawaii, it also
- 2 prevents many individuals and families from experiencing
- 3 homelessness.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require state agencies to
- 5 report annually to the governor's coordinator on homelessness
- 6 information on any vacant state land that could be utilized for
- 7 the construction of affordable housing.
- 8 SECTION 2. Each state agency shall submit to the
- 9 governor's coordinator on homelessness an annual report on any
- 10 vacant state land suitable for the construction of affordable
- 11 housing within its jurisdiction or the jurisdiction of any of
- 12 its attached offices, brands, commissions, or other agencies.
- 13 SECTION 3. The governor's coordinator on homelessness
- 14 shall compile the agency reports and submit an annual report of
- 15 their findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 16 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 17 to the convening of each regular session.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
