A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 11-381, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Campaign funds may be used by a candidate, treasurer,
4	or candidate committee:
5	(1) For any purpose directly related:
6	(A) In the case of the candidate, to the candidate's
7	own campaign; or
8	(B) In the case of a candidate committee or treasurer
9	of a candidate committee, to the campaign of the
10	candidate, question, or issue with which they are
11	directly associated;
12	(2) To purchase or lease consumer goods, vehicles,
13	equipment, and services that provide a mixed benefit
14	to the candidate. The candidate, however, shall
15	reimburse the candidate's candidate committee for the
16	candidate's personal use of these items unless the
17	personal use is de minimis;



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1	(3)	To m	ake donations to any community service,
2		educ	ational, youth, recreational, charitable,
3		scie	ntific, or literary organization; provided that in
4		any	election period, the total amount of all donations
5		shal	l be no more than [twice the maximum amount that
6		one -	person may contribute to that candidate pursuant
7		to s	ection 11-357;] \$6,000 for a candidate to a two-
8		year	office, \$12,000 for a candidate to a four-year
9		nons	tatewide office, and \$18,000 for a candidate to a
10		four	-year statewide office; provided further that no
11		dona	tions shall be made from the date the candidate
12		file	s nomination papers to the date of the general
13		elec	tion unless the candidate is:
14		(A)	Declared to be duly and legally elected to the
15			office for which the person is a candidate
16			pursuant to section 12-41;
17		(B)	Deemed and declared to be duly and legally
18			elected to the office for which the person is a
19			candidate pursuant to section 12-42; or
20		(C)	Unsuccessful in the primary or special primary
21			election;



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1	(4)	To make donations to any public school or public
2		library; provided that in any election period, the
3		total amount of all contributions shall be no more
4		than [twice the maximum amount that one person may
5		contribute to that candidate pursuant to section
6		11-357;] \$6,000 for a candidate to a two-year office,
7		\$12,000 for a candidate to a four-year nonstatewide
8		office, and \$18,000 for a candidate to a four-year
9		statewide office; provided further that any donation
10		under this paragraph shall not be aggregated with or
11		imputed toward any limitation on donations pursuant to
12		paragraph (3);
13	(5)	To award scholarships to full-time students attending
14		an institution of higher education or a vocational
15		education school in a program leading to a degree,

16 certificate, or other recognized educational

17 credential; provided that in any election period, the 18 total amount of all scholarships awarded shall be no 19 more than twice the maximum amount that one person may 20 contribute to that candidate pursuant to section 21 11-357; provided further that no awards shall be made

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1		from the filing deadline for nomination papers to the
2		date of the general election unless the candidate is:
3		(A) Declared to be duly and legally elected to the
4		office for which the person is a candidate
5		pursuant to section 12-41;
6		(B) Deemed and declared to be duly and legally
7		elected to the office for which the person is a
8		candidate pursuant to section 12-42; or
9		(C) Unsuccessful in the primary or special primary
10		election;
11	(6)	To purchase not more than two tickets for each event
12		held by another candidate or committee, regardless of
13		whether the event constitutes a fundraiser as defined
14		in section 11-342;
15	(7)	To make contributions to the candidate's party so long
16		as the contributions are not earmarked for another
17		candidate; or
18	(8)	To pay for ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in
19		connection with the candidate's duties as a holder of
20		an office, including expenses incurred for memberships
21		in civic or community groups."

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SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Increases the cap on the amount of campaign funds candidates may donate to any community service, educational, youth, recreational, charitable, scientific, or literary organization, or public school or library to \$6,000 for a candidate to a twoyear office, \$12,000 for a candidate to a four-year nonstatewide office, and \$18,000 for a candidate to a four-year statewide office.
