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### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ACCESSIBILITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§321- Retail establishment; restroom access; eligible
5	medical condition. (a) A retail establishment that has a
6	toilet facility for its employees shall allow a customer to use
7	that facility during normal business hours; provided that the
8	following conditions are met:
9	(1) The customer requesting the use of the employee toilet
10	facility suffers from an eligible medical condition
11	and provides the retail establishment with proof of an
12	eligible medical condition, in the form of:
13	(A) A statement signed by a physician; or
14	(B) A specially issued card from a health
15	organization or state health agency.
16	(2) Three or more employees of the retail establishment
17	are working and physically present on the premises of

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1		the retail establishment at the time the customer
2		requests use of the employee toilet facility;
3	(3)	The retail establishment does not have a public
4		restroom that is immediately accessible to the
5		customer;
6	(4)	The employee toilet facility is reasonably safe and is
7		not located in an area where providing access would
8		create an obvious health or safety risk to the
9		customer or an obvious security risk to the retail
10		establishment; and
11	(5)	A public restroom is not immediately accessible to the
12		customer.
13	(b)	A retail establishment or an employee of a retail
14	establish	ment shall not be civilly liable for any damages
15	arising f	rom an act or omission in allowing a customer that has
16	an eligib	le medical condition to use an employee toilet facility
17	that is n	ot a public restroom; provided that the act or
18	omission:	
19	(1)	Is not wilful or grossly negligent;
20	(2)	Occurs in an area of the retail establishment that is
21		not accessible to the public; and



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1	<u>(3)</u> R	esults in an injury to or death of the customer or
2	<u>a</u>	ny individual other than an employee accompanying the
3	<u>c</u>	ustomer.
4	(c) A	retail establishment shall not be required to make
5	any physica	l modification to an employee toilet facility for the
6	purposes of	this section.
7	(d) A	ny retail establishment or employee of a retail
8	establishme	nt who violates this section shall be fined not more
9	than \$100 f	or each violation.
10	(e) F	or the purposes of this section:
11	"Custo	mer" means an individual who is lawfully on the
12	premises of	a retail establishment.
13	<u>"Eligi</u>	ble medical condition" means Crohn's disease,
14	ulcerative	colitis, any other inflammatory bowel disease,
15	irritable b	owel syndrome, or any other medical condition that
16	requires im	mediate access to a toilet facility.
17	"Physi	cian" means an individual authorized to practice
18	medicine or	osteopathy under the law of any state.
19	<u>"Retai</u>	l establishment" means a place of business open to
20	the general	public for the sale of goods or services. "Retail
21	establishme:	nt" does not include a retail automobile service

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- 1 station, with a structure of eight hundred square feet or less,
- 2 that has an employee toilet facility located within that
- 3 structure."
- 4 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.

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### Report Title:

Restroom Access; Retail Establishment; Eligible Medical Condition

#### Description:

Requires a retail establishment with an employee toilet facility to allow a customer suffering from an eligible medical condition to use that restroom during normal business hours, under certain conditions. Exempts a retail establishment and employees from civil liability in allowing an eligible customer to use an employee toilet facility. Establishes fines.
