A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STUDENT OUT-OF-SERVICE-AREA ATTENDANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that overcrowding in
schools negatively affects student achievement levels, stress
levels, attendance, and concentration. School overcrowding also
has a detrimental effect on teacher morale and limits the time
available for teachers to adequately plan and deliver lectures.

6 The legislature further finds that multi-tracking is an 7 approach used to address school overcrowding by dividing students and faculty into multiple groups who attend school 8 9 year-round on alternating schedules. However, multi-tracked 10 schools have tested an average of two per cent lower than 11 students in traditional schools on national reading, math, and 12 language assessments. Studies have also shown that 13 multi-tracking is more expensive over the long term and can harm 14 community and family cohesion and lead to increased stress and 15 burnout for students, teachers, and parents.

16 The legislature believes that school overcrowding and the 17 need for multi-tracking in the Kapolei complex has been



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1 partially caused by the mandatory reassignment of students who 2 would otherwise attend a school in the Nanakuli complex. Assigning these students to schools in their own Nanakuli 3 4 complex would help balance the distribution of students among the complex areas within the Leeward district and ease 5 overcrowding in the Kapolei complex without the need to 6 7 multi-track. 8 The purpose of this Act is to gradually end the department 9 of education's practice of mandating that students attend a 10 school outside their service area. SECTION 2. Section 302A-1143, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§302A-1143 Attending school in [what] a service area. A person of school age shall be required to attend the school of 14 15 the service area, as determined by the department, in which the person resides, unless: 16 The person is enrolled in a Hawaiian language medium 17 (1) education program or charter school; 18 19 (2) A geographic exception to attend a school in another 20 service area is requested and granted at the 21 discretion of the department; or

3	SECT	ION 3. The department of education shall reduce the
4	out-of-se	rvice-area attendance mandated by the department of
5	education	as follows:
6	(1)	For the 2023-2024 school year, the number of sixth
7		grade students mandated by the department of education
8		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more
9		than eighty per cent of the sixth grade students
10		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the
11		2021-2022 school year;
12	(2)	For the 2024-2025 school year, the number of sixth
13		grade students mandated by the department of education
14		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more
15		than sixty per cent of the sixth grade students
16		mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the
17		2021-2022 school year;
18	(3)	For the 2025-2026 school year, the number of sixth
19		grade students mandated by the department of education
20		for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more
21		than forty per cent of the sixth grade students



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1 mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the 2 2021-2022 school year; and 3 (4) For the 2026-2027 school year, the number of sixth 4 grade students mandated by the department of education 5 for out-of-service-area attendance shall not be more 6 than twenty per cent of the sixth grade students mandated for out-of-service-area attendance during the 7 8 2021-2022 school year. 9 SECTION 4. No later than twenty days prior to the 10 convening of the regular sessions of 2025, 2026, 2027, 2028, and 2029, the department of education shall submit a report to the 11 12 legislature on its progress to comply with this Act. The report 13 shall also include information, beginning with the 2021-2022 14 school year, on the number of students statewide in each grade 15 that have been mandated by the department of education for out-16 of-service-area attendance.

17 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2027. 2 3
