A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that transforming
- 2 Hawaii's surface transportation systems and infrastructure to
- 3 prioritize walking, rolling, bicycling, and public transit is at
- 4 the nexus of the State's commitments to public health, safety,
- 5 economic vitality, and environmental sustainability. The most
- 6 important component of this transformation is ensuring that
- 7 every child in Hawaii enjoys the infrastructure, social support,
- 8 confidence, and skills to walk, roll, bike, or bus to school.
- 9 The legislature further finds that ensuring safe routes for
- 10 every keiki will not only protect our most vulnerable road
- 11 users, but also serves as a long-term investment in the future
- 12 of mobility.
- 13 The legislature also finds that as a result of decades of
- 14 automobile-centric planning and development, there are
- 15 formidable barriers to this transformation. These barriers
- 16 include a lack of complete, safe, and comfortable bike and
- 17 pedestrian networks; burdensome and complicated funding

- 2 engagement; a lack of a state safe routes to school plan that
- 3 creates performance measures, goals, strategies, and
- 4 accountability; and a lack of coordination of safe routes to
- 5 school promotion among state and county agencies and community-
- 6 based organizations.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 8 (1) Establish the safe routes to school advisory committee
 9 to coordinate with the department of transportation
 10 and other necessary stakeholders to develop a safe
- 11 routes to school plan that sets goals for safe routes
- to school programming within the state, defines roles
- and responsibilities, ensures participation of
- 14 vulnerable populations, and makes recommendations for
- optimizing the use of available state and federal
- funds for safe routes to school programs; and
- 17 (2) Appropriate funds for the hiring of a full-time safe
- 18 routes to school coordinator within the department of
- 19 transportation.
- 20 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a safe routes to
- 21 school advisory committee within the highway division of the



- 1 department of transportation for administrative purposes. The
- 2 purpose of the advisory committee is to advise the State on
- 3 strategies to ensure that all children in the State are able to
- 4 safely bike, walk, roll, or bus to school. The advisory
- 5 committee shall develop a comprehensive statewide safe routes to
- 6 school strategic plan, that shall at a minimum:
- 7 (1) Identify ways to stabilize the safe routes special
- fund distribution mechanism;
- 9 (2) Recommend strategies to streamline safe routes to
 10 school program funding to make it easier for schools
 11 and communities to apply for and receive funds;
- 12 (3) Identify and recommend funding mechanisms, planning 13 processes, and programming that are inclusive and 14 equitable; and
- 15 (4) Recommend strategies to prioritize safe routes to
 16 school programming serving students attending schools
 17 that receive federal funds pursuant to Title I of the
 18 federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as
 19 amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act.
- 20 (b) The advisory committee shall make publicly available21 its final strategic plan on or before November 1, 2025.

1	(c)	The advisory committee shall submit a copy of its						
2	strategic	plan, including any proposed legislation, to the						
3	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of							
4	the regular session of 2026.							
5	(d)	The advisory committee shall consist of the following						
6	members:							
7	(1)	The State of Hawaii safe routes to school coordinator;						
8	(2)	The physical activity and nutrition coordinator within						
9		the department of health;						
10	(3)	The school wellness coordinator within the department						
11		of health;						
12	(4)	A representative of the department of education;						
13	(5)	A representative of the Honolulu police department;						
14	(6)	A representative of the Kauai police department;						
15	(7)	A representative of the Hawaii police department;						
16	(8)	A representative of the Maui police department;						
17	(9)	The city and county of Honolulu safe routes to school						
18		coordinator;						
19	(10)	The county of Kauai safe routes to school coordinator;						
20	(11)	The county of Hawaii safe routes to school						
21		coordinator; and						

- 1 (12) The county of Maui safe routes to school coordinator.
- 2 (e) The advisory committee shall select a chair from
- 3 amongst its members, who shall invite the following individuals
- 4 to become members of the advisory committee:
- 5 (1) A representative of the Maui metropolitan planning
- 6 organization;
- 7 (2) A representative of Papa Ola Lokahi;
- 8 (3) A representative of the Hawaii Bicycling League;
- 9 (4) A representative of the Hawaii Public Health
- 10 Institute; and
- 11 (5) Any other members recommended by the advisory
- committee.
- 13 (f) The advisory committee shall meet at least monthly to
- 14 review the State's progress in implementing its safe routes to
- 15 school program and shall make recommendations to the department
- 16 of transportation on at least a bi-annual basis. The advisory
- 17 committee may meet and subsequently make recommendations at
- 18 additional times as determined by a majority of the members.
- 19 (q) The members of the safe routes to school advisory
- 20 committee shall serve without compensation but shall be

- 1 reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary
- 2 for the performance of their duties.
- 3 (h) The advisory committee shall cease to exist on
- 4 June 30, 2026.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 8 staffing of the department of transportation pursuant to this
- 9 Act, including the hiring of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 10 safe routes to school coordinator position and for any necessary
- 11 facilities and equipment.

- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 15 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
