A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 171-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§171-2 Definition of public lands. "Public lands" means all lands or interest therein in the State classed as government 4 5 or crown lands previous to August 15, 1895, or acquired or 6 reserved by the government upon or subsequent to that date by 7 purchase, exchange, escheat, or the exercise of the right of 8 eminent domain, or in any other manner; including lands accreted 9 after May 20, 2003, and not otherwise awarded, submerged lands, 10 and lands beneath tidal waters that are suitable for 11 reclamation, together with reclaimed lands that have been given 12 the status of public lands under this chapter, except: 13 (1) Lands designated in section 203 of the Hawaiian Homes 14 Commission Act, 1920, as amended; 15 (2) Lands set aside pursuant to law for the use of the 16 United States; 17 (3) Lands being used for roads and streets;



1 (4)Lands to which the United States relinguished the 2 absolute fee and ownership under section 91 of the 3 Hawaiian Organic Act prior to the admission of Hawaii 4 as a state of the United States unless subsequently 5 placed under the control of the board of land and natural resources and given the status of public lands 6 7 in accordance with the state constitution, the 8 Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, or 9 other laws; 10 (5) Lands to which the University of Hawaii holds title; 11 (6) [Lands] Non-ceded lands set aside by the governor to 12 the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation 13 or lands to which the Hawaii housing finance and 14 development corporation in its corporate capacity 15 holds title; 16 (7) Lands to which the Hawaii community development 17 authority in its corporate capacity holds title; 18 Lands set aside by the governor to the Hawaii public (8) 19 housing authority or lands to which the Hawaii public 20 housing authority in its corporate capacity holds 21 title;

provided that, except as otherwise limited under federal law and 3 4 except for state land used as an airport as defined in section 262-1, public lands shall include the air rights over any 5 portion of state land upon which a county mass transit project 6 is developed after July 11, 2005; provided further that if the 7 8 lands pursuant to paragraph (14) are no longer needed for the stadium development district or related purposes, the lands 9 10 shall be returned to the public land trust administered by the 11 department."

SECTION 2. Section 171-64.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

14 "(a) This section applies to all lands or interest therein 15 owned or under the control of state departments and agencies classed as government or crown lands previous to August 15, 16 1895, or acquired or reserved by the government upon or 17 18 subsequent to that date by purchase, exchange, escheat, or the exercise of the right of eminent domain, or any other manner, 19 20 including accreted lands not otherwise awarded, submerged lands, and lands beneath tidal waters that are suitable for 21
