## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEARCH AND RESCUE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii is an outdoor playground that is world-
- 2 renowned for beautiful hikes through lush green forests and
- 3 mountains. However, the ongoing coronavirus pandemic has led to
- 4 a surge of experienced and inexperienced hikers venturing into
- 5 the outdoors. Occasionally, hikers ignore posted warning signs,
- 6 intentionally leave hiking trails, or enter properties that are
- 7 closed to the public. When these hikers need to be rescued, the
- 8 State bears the burden of paying for the costs associated with
- 9 the search or rescue.
- 10 In response to having to pay the cost of rescuing
- 11 recreational hikers who take unnecessary risks, several states,
- 12 including Idaho, Maine, New Hampshire, Oregon, South Dakota, and
- 13 Vermont, have passed legislation that allows the state to offset
- 14 the costs associated with the search or rescue by seeking
- 15 reimbursement from the rescued party.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to require government entities
- 17 to seek reimbursement for expenses arising from the search and

- 1 rescue of persons who ignore posted warnings, intentionally
- 2 leave a hiking trail to enter a prohibited area, or hike on a
- 3 trail that is closed to the public.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 137-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "[+]\$137-2[+] Reimbursement. (a) [Whenever] Subject to
- 7 subsection (b), whenever any government entity engages in a
- 8 search or rescue operation for the purpose of searching for or
- 9 rescuing a person, and incurs search and rescue expenses
- 10 therein, the government entity may seek reimbursement from the
- 11 following:
- 12 (1) The person on whose behalf search or rescue operations
- were conducted, including the person's estate,
- 14 guardians, custodians, or other entity responsible for
- the person's safety;
- 16 (2) A person who ultimately benefited from a search or
- 17 rescue operation by being rescued; or
- 18 (3) Any entity responsible for placing the person in the
- 19 position of danger for which the search or rescue
- 20 operation was initiated.

1	[ <del>(b)</del>	Reimbursement under subsection (a) shall be allowed
2	only if t	he need for search or rescue was caused by any act or
3	omission	by the person searched for or rescued, constituting
4	intention	al-disregard for the person's safety, including, but
5	not limit	ed to, intentionally disregarding a warning or notice.
6	(b)	A government entity shall seek reimbursement from all
7	applicabl	e persons or entities in subsection (a) for search or
8	rescue ex	penses if the search or rescue was necessary because
9	the perso	n who was the subject of the search or rescue
10	unreasonably disregarded the person's safety by:	
11	(1)	Ignoring reasonably posted warnings and closures;
12	(2)	Leaving a managed and authorized hiking trail, or park
13		boundary, for the purpose of entering a closed area or
14		trail on state, county, or private property that is
15		closed to the public, and reasonable notice of the
16		closure is posted; or
17	(3)	Entering a hiking trail or park that is closed to the
18		public and reasonable notice of the closure is
19		posted. "

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Hiking Trails; Search and Rescue; Closed to the Public; Trespassing; Reimbursement

## Description:

Requires government entities to seek reimbursement for search and rescue expenses for persons who require rescue after leaving a hiking trail to enter a prohibited area or hiking on a trail closed to the public. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
