## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IN VITRO FERTILIZATION INSURANCE COVERAGE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that reproductive
- 2 technologies, such as in vitro fertilization, are extremely
- 3 important to many who desire to have children. The legislature
- 4 also finds that the State's mandate that insurance plans provide
- 5 a one-time benefit for costs associated with in vitro
- 6 fertilization procedures, though admirable, excludes same-sex
- 7 couples, unmarried women, and male-female couples for whom male
- 8 infertility is the relevant factor. While some insurers
- 9 independently offer policies that cover female couples or women
- 10 without male partners, these policies are not guaranteed by law
- 11 and not all cover single women. Finally, male-female couples
- 12 for whom male infertility is the relevant factor are excluded
- 13 through the current statutory requirement that the covered
- 14 treatment involve sperm from the male spouse.
- 15 The legislature further finds that the current unequal
- 16 treatment of individuals seeking medical fertility assistance
- 17 constitutes discrimination on the basis of sex, sexual

- 1 orientation, and marital status. In vitro fertilization
- 2 procedures are expensive, costing \$10,000 to \$15,000 per cycle,
- 3 which is approximately half of the average annual disposable
- 4 income in the United States. Same-sex couples, unmarried women,
- 5 and male-female couples affected by male infertility must
- 6 unreasonably bear the full cost of the procedures while male-
- 7 female married couples for whom female infertility is the
- 8 relevant factor do not bear the same burden.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to ensure equal access to in
- 10 vitro fertilization for all couples, including same-sex couples,
- 11 and for women regardless of their marital status.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 431:10A-116.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 13 is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) All individual and group accident and health or
- 15 sickness insurance policies [which] that provide pregnancy-
- 16 related benefits shall include, in addition to any other
- 17 benefits for treating infertility, a one-time only benefit for
- 18 all outpatient expenses arising from in vitro fertilization
- 19 procedures performed on the insured or the insured's dependent
- 20 spouse; provided that:

- 1 SECTION 4. The coverage for in vitro fertilization
- 2 services required under sections 2 and 3 of this Act is not
- 3 intended to apply to the medicaid program.
- 4 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.

Removes discriminatory requirements for mandatory insurance coverage of in vitro fertilization procedures to create parity of coverage for same-sex couples, unmarried women, and malefemale couples for whom male infertility is the relevant factor. (SD1)
