A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has the 2 highest rate of homelessness per capita of any state in the 3 nation. Hawaii also has the highest rate in the nation, per 4 capita, of chronically unsheltered homeless. According to the 5 Hawaii Homelessness Initiative Point in Time Report for 2020, an estimated 6,458 people live on the streets and in shelters in 6 7 Hawaii. Addressing homelessness requires a multi-faceted 8 approach that uses interventions that are targeted to the 9 characteristics of the population being served. The state rent 10 supplement for homeless families and individuals is critically 11 necessary to address homelessness.

12 The legislature further finds that the state rent 13 supplement program provides a "shallow", but sustained subsidy 14 to struggling households. Unlike the "deep" subsidy housing 15 choice voucher program, better known as the section 8 program, 16 which helps families at the lowest ends of the income scale by 17 bridging a wide affordability gap between income and housing



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1	costs, the state rent supplement program helps households who
2	are closer to financial self-sufficiency but still have a narrow
3	affordability gap to fill. The state rent supplement program
4	provides an ongoing subsidy, enabling homeless households or
5	those at imminent risk of homelessness to close the
6	affordability gap, maintain housing, and achieve self-
7	sufficiency.
8	Because individual subsidies under state rent supplement
9	programs are relatively low, the programs can resolve
10	homelessness for many individuals and families relative to the
11	total cost of the subsidy program.
12	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to support
13	the state rent supplement program.
14	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
17	the state rent supplement program established pursuant to
18	section 356D-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
19	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
20	housing authority for the purposes of this Act.
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1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
