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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO CRISIS OUTREACH PROGRAMS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that CAHOOTS (Crisis  
2 Assistance Helping Out On The Streets) is a promising model of  
3 responding to crises involving mental illness, homelessness, and  
4 addiction. CAHOOTS was developed by the City of Eugene, Oregon  
5 in 1989 to address crisis situations where a social service  
6 response is more appropriate than a law enforcement response.  
7 The CAHOOTS model uses teams of two, composed of a crisis  
8 intervention worker and a medic who is either a nurse or an  
9 emergency medical technician, and who are trained in de-  
10 escalation and crisis intervention methods.

11       According to Eugene's CAHOOTS program, in 2019 it handled  
12 more than twenty-four thousand calls, representing seventeen per  
13 cent of the calls dispatched by 911, and needed to call for  
14 police backup two hundred and fifty times. Annually, the  
15 program is estimated to save \$8.5 million for public safety  
16 spending and \$14 million on emergency medical costs, including  
17 ambulance transport and emergency room services. The three main



1 types of calls that are diverted to CAHOOTS are for welfare  
2 checks (32.5 per cent of all CAHOOTS calls), public assistance  
3 (66.3 per cent), and transportation to services (34.8 per cent),  
4 with some calls requiring more than one type of assistance.

5 The legislature further finds that a number of cities are  
6 exploring ways to implement a program modeled after CAHOOTS. In  
7 Hawai'i such a crisis program could be connected to existing  
8 crisis phone lines and the forthcoming national suicide  
9 prevention lifeline. The publicity campaign in support of the  
10 national 988 suicide lifeline is anticipated to increase crisis  
11 calls by thirty per cent.

12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate  
13 funds to the adult mental health division of the department of  
14 health to support a statewide CAHOOTS-like crisis outreach  
15 program.

16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,700,000 or so much  
18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for a  
19 statewide crisis outreach program.



1       The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
2   health adult mental health division for the purposes of this  
3   Act.

4       SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
