## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION GRANTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) No later than , the department	
2	of educat	ion shall establish and administer the strong students	
3	grant pilot program to provide grants for eligible education		
4	expenses	to eligible students who qualify for a grant under the	
5	program.		
6	(d)	To administer the program, the department shall:	
7	(1)	Establish a grant application process for parents of	
8		eligible students to apply for the program;	
9	(2)	Select a third party to build a grant distribution	
10		platform;	
<b>11</b> ·	(3)	Administer, or select a third party to administer, the	
12		grant distribution platform; and	
13	(4)	Subject to appropriation, award grants to qualified	
14		students under this Act.	
15	(c)	The department may:	

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Retain other contractors as necessary to administer 1 (1) 2 the program and delegate program functions to the 3 contractors; and 4 (2) Take other actions as necessary to establish, 5 administer, and enforce the provisions of this Act. 6 (d) The awarding of grants shall be contingent on the 7 department of taxation verification of the tax information 8 submitted by the parent and shall be made to eligible students 9 pursuant to prioritization rules adopted by the department, 10 which shall substantially conform with the following order of 11 preference: Eligible students whose families have an adjusted 12 (1) 13 gross income of \$50,000 or less, or as otherwise 14 provided by rule of the department to account for 15 family size; 16 Starting on September 15 of each calendar year, (2) 17 eligible students whose families have an annual gross 18 income of \$75,000 or less, or as otherwise provided by 19 rule of the department to account for family size; and

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1 (3) Starting on November 1 of each calendar year, eligible 2 students on a first come, first served basis until all 3 available funds are awarded; 4 provided that the department shall adopt rules without regard to 5 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to equitably account for 6 family size in awarding grants pursuant to this subsection; 7 provided further that applications for program grants shall not 8 be accepted after December 1 of each calendar year. 9 (e) Notification of grant awards for eligible students 10 under paragraph (d)(1) shall be made within thirty days from the department's receipt of the application from the parent of the 11 12 eligible student. Grant funds under paragraph (d)(1) shall be 13 made available for participants' use as soon as practicable but 14 not more than thirty days after notification of the grant award. 15 (f) Prior to the award of a grant, the parent of a 16 participant shall agree to verify compliance with the program 17 requirements. 18 If a parent of a participant is found to misuse grant (q) 19 funds, then neither the parent nor another parent of the

participant living in the same household may apply for any

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future program grants; provided that a parent may appeal the
 finding of misuse to the department.

3 (h) Grant funds under the program shall be expended in the
4 fiscal year in which the funds are awarded and shall only be
5 used for eligible education expenses. Any unused funds at the
6 end of a fiscal year shall revert to the state general fund.

7 (i) The pilot program shall cease to exist on July 1,

8 (j) For the purposes of this Act:

9 "Assessment" means an examination or other objective
10 evaluation of a student's academic performance, academic
11 engagement, or college or career readiness.

12 "Contractor" means an individual or entity with whom the 13 department enters into a contract for the purpose of performing 14 a program function.

15 "Department" means the department of education.

16 "Eligible education expenses" means:

17 (1) Computer hardware, internet access, or other

technological devices or services that are primarily

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19 used to meet a participant's educational needs;



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1	(2)	Textbooks, curriculum, or other instructional	
2		materials, including educational software and	
3		applications;	
4	(3)	Fees for national standardized assessments, advanced	
5		placement examinations, examinations related to	
6		college or university admissions, or industry-	
7		recognized certification examinations;	
8	(4)	Therapies including but not limited to occupational,	
9		behavioral, physical, speech-language, and audiology	
10		therapies, or other services or therapies specifically	
11		approved by the department; and	
12	(5)	Supplemental education services, as permitted under	
13		the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.	
14	"Eli	gible student" means a student attending a public	
15	school in	grades kindergarten through twelve.	
16	"Gra	nt" means an award of \$1,000 that shall be used for	
17	eligible education expenses.		
18	"Gra	nt distribution platform" means a device through which	
19	grant fun	ds are transferred from the department to the parents	
20	of participants.		

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"Parent" means a parent or legal guardian of an eligible
 student or participant.

3 "Participant" means an eligible student for whom a grant is4 awarded under the program.

5 "Program" means the strong students grant pilot program.
6 "Public School" means a department school governed by
7 chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a public charter
8 school governed by chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

9 SECTION 2. (a) The department shall submit a report to 10 the legislature on its efforts to establish the strong students 11 grant pilot program established by this Act, including any 12 findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to 13 the convening of the regular session of 2023.

(b) The department shall submit a report to the legislature on its efforts to implement the strong students grant pilot program established by this Act, including any findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2024.

19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to

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establish and administer the strong students grant pilot program
 established by this Act.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of4 education for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
