A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is great 2 demand for high quality mental health practitioners in the 3 State, which is especially acute with the ongoing coronavirus 4 disease 2019 pandemic and its associated hardships. 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to expand access to 6 high quality mental health services by: 7 Establishing provisional or associate-level licensure (1) 8 requirements and reimbursement allowances for certain 9 mental health practitioners in training; and 10 (2) Allowing psychologist license applicants to sit for the licensing examination before completing other 11 12 requirements.
- 13 PART I
- SECTION 2. Chapter 451J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

Clinical supervision includes but is 17 not limited to case consultation of the assessment and diagnosis of presenting problems, development and implementation of 18 treatment plans, and the evaluation of the course of treatment. 19 20 Clinical supervision may include direct observation by the

1 qualified supervisor of the provision of marriage and family therapy services." 2 3. By deleting the definition of "marriage and family 3 4 therapy intern". [""Marriage and family therapy intern" means a person who 5 6 has completed all educational requirements stipulated in section 7 451J-7(1)(A) and who is currently earning supervised clinical 8 experience in marriage and family therapy under clinical 9 supervision."] 10 SECTION 4. Section 451J-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§451J-3 Powers and duties of the director.
