## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that the Federal-Aid SECTION 1.
- 2 Highway Act of 1962 required metropolitan planning organizations
- 3 to be established for any urbanized area with a population over
- 4 50,000 as a condition to eliqibility for federal transportation
- 5 financial assistance. Congress intended metropolitan planning
- 6 organizations to serve as a forum for promoting collaboration
- 7 among local communities and government agencies and to direct
- 8 federal funds toward projects that increase access to
- 9 opportunity and prosperity through improved multimodal
- 10 pedestrian, bicycle, and transit options.
- 11 The legislature further finds that there are two
- 12 established metropolitan planning organizations operating in the
- 13 State of Hawaii, one located in the county of Maui and the other
- 14 in the city and county of Honolulu. According to the 2020
- 15 United States Census, which provides critical data that
- lawmakers, business owners, and many others use to provide daily 16
- 17 services, products, and support for communities throughout the



1	nation, t	he population of the county of Hawaiʻi has grown to					
2	200,2691;	thus moving local officials to reexamine the					
3	feasibility of a metropolitan planning organization to address						
4	the many	transportation infrastructure and connectivity					
5	challenges exasperated by its growing population and topography						
6	SECTION 2. The department of transportation shall convene						
7	an intergovernmental task force to assist the county of Hawaii						
8	to:						
9	(1)	Form an agreement with the necessary governmental					
10		entities to establish a metropolitan planning					
11		organization for the county of Hawaii;					
12	(2)	Develop a transportation improvement program for the					
13		urbanized areas in the county of Hawaii that is					
14		consistent with the federal metropolitan					
15		transportation plan;					
16	(3)	Adopt priorities and planning processes to implement					
17		the highway projects of the transportation improvement					
18		program; and					
19	(4)	Self-certify that the metropolitan planning					

organization for the county of Hawaii has met all

federal requirements.

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1 The department of transportation shall also provide the 2 intergovernmental task force with a list of highway projects to 3 be executed within the next four years from the state 4 transportation improvement program to support the development of the metropolitan planning organization's transportation 5 6 improvement program. 7 SECTION 3. The intergovernmental task force shall be comprised of the following members: 8 9 (1) The governor or his designee; 10 The mayor of the county of Hawaii or his designee; (2) 11 (3) A senator representing a district from Hawaii Island, 12 to be appointed by the president of the Senate; 13 A representative representing a district from Hawaii (4)14 Island, to be appointed by the speaker of the house of 15 representatives; A member of the Hawaii county council, to be appointed 16 (5) 17 by the chairperson of the Hawaii county council; 18 (6) The Hawaii district engineer from the department of 19 transportation; and 20 (7) The department of public works director of the county 21

of Hawaii or his designee.

1 SECT	ION 4.	The	intergovernmental	task	force	shall	submit	a
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- 2 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 3 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 4 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2023. The
- 5 intergovernmental task force shall be dissolved upon submittal
- 6 of its report.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

#### Report Title:

Metropolitan Planning Organization; County of Hawaii; Department of Transportation; Task Force; Transportation Improvement Program; Certification

#### Description:

Creates a temporary intergovernmental task force to assist in the establishment and certification of a metropolitan planning organization for the county of Hawaii. Requires the Department of Transportation to provide a list of certain highway projects to the task force. Requires a report to the legislature.

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
