## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPOSTING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to the
- 2 United States Environmental Protection Agency and United States
- 3 Department of Agriculture, food waste is the second-largest
- 4 component that enters a waste stream and accounts for twenty-
- 5 five per cent of all materials sent to landfills. The recycling
- 6 of food waste into compost has environmental benefits, including
- 7 improved soil health, increased drought resistance, and
- 8 reduction in the need for supplemental water, fertilizers, and
- 9 pesticides.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the application of
- 11 compost and organic matter to soil sequesters carbon from the
- 12 atmosphere, forming the largest land-based carbon sink, and
- 13 mitigates climate change through the reduction of greenhouse gas
- 14 emissions. The legislature believes that food waste diversion
- 15 would help move the State toward the Aloha+ Challenge commitment
- 16 of seventy per cent waste stream reduction by 2025.

1 The legislature additionally finds that Act 89, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2018, required the department of agriculture to 3 establish a three-year compost reimbursement pilot program to 4 provide reimbursements to farmers and ranchers who purchased 5 compost from a certified processor, dealer, retailer, or 6 wholesaler licensed to do business in the State. The pilot 7 program was not extended and ended on December 31, 2021. 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate 9 moneys to the department of agriculture to reestablish and 10 implement a compost reimbursement pilot program to assist farmers and ranchers in the State with affordable compost 11 12 material. 13 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall 14 establish and implement a three-year compost reimbursement pilot 15 program to provide cost reimbursement to farming operations in 16 the State to assist farmers and ranchers in meeting the costs of 17 acquiring compost purchased from a certified processor, dealer, 18 retailer, or wholesaler licensed to do business in the State.

Applications for cost reimbursements shall be

submitted on a form furnished by the department and shall be

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- 1 filed with accompanying documentation of the costs of purchasing
- 2 compost pursuant to subsection (c); provided that:
- 3 (1) The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the
- 4 State and its officers, agents, and employees from all
- 5 claims arising out of or resulting from the compost
- 6 purchased; and
- 7 (2) The department may request an applicant to provide
- 8 necessary information for the purposes of verifying
- 9 the size or sale weight, as applicable, and amount of
- 10 compost purchased.
- 11 (c) Documentation of compost costs, requested by the
- 12 department, shall be filed for compost purchased within the
- 13 fiscal year immediately preceding the filing and be effective
- 14 for compost costs incurred after June 30, 2022, and before
- 15 July 1, 2025.
- 16 (d) Funds shall be dispersed upon approval on an annual
- 17 basis by the department to the farmer or rancher for up to fifty
- 18 per cent of the costs incurred for the purchase of the compost
- 19 after June 30, 2022, and before July 1, 2025.
- (e) The department shall aggregate the total reimbursement
- 21 applications pursuant to this section and divide and distribute

- 1 the available moneys on a first come, first served basis;
- 2 provided that no single farmer or rancher shall receive a
- 3 reimbursement total of more than \$ per year.
- 4 (f) There is established within the department a compost
- 5 reimbursement pilot program manager position, which shall be a
- 6 full-time, temporary position exempt from chapters 76 and 89,
- 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes. The compost reimbursement pilot
- 8 program manager shall possess a requisite level of knowledge and
- 9 expertise in the area of program management necessary to carry
- 10 out the duties of the position. The compost reimbursement pilot
- 11 program manager shall:
- 12 (1) Facilitate the division and distribution of available
- costs for reimbursement; and
- 14 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination of the compost
- reimbursement pilot program.
- 16 The compost reimbursement pilot program manager shall receive a
- 17 salary not to exceed \$ per year.
- 18 (g) Any action taken by the department pursuant to this
- 19 section shall be exempt from the rulemaking requirements of
- 20 section 91-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 21 (h) As used in this section:

- 1 "Compost" means a product of a process in which organic
- 2 materials are biologically decomposed under controlled
- 3 conditions to produce a stable humus-like mulch or soil
- 4 amendment. The composting process includes but is not limited
- 5 to the receipt of materials, primary processing, decomposition
- 6 activities, and final processing for sale and marketing.
- 7 Compostable materials shall include pre- and post-consumer food
- 8 waste, waste from animal food processing operations, green
- 9 waste, crop residues, and waste from vegetable food processing
- 10 operations and similar materials.
- 11 "Department" means the department of agriculture.
- 12 "Farming operation" shall have the same meaning as in
- 13 section 165-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 14 SECTION 3. The department of agriculture shall submit a
- 15 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 16 proposed legislation, regarding the results of the compost
- 17 reimbursement pilot program and whether the program should be
- 18 reinstated, with or without modifications, to the legislature no
- 19 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- **20** session of 2025.

1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 2 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for department of agriculture to develop and implement a compost 4 reimbursement pilot program pursuant to section 2 of this Act; 5 provided that the department of agriculture may expend: 6 7 (1) \$ per year to establish one full-time, temporary program manager position for the compost 8 9 reimbursement pilot program; and 10 (2) \$ per year for program and administrative 11 costs. 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of agriculture for the purposes of this Act; provided that this 13 appropriation shall not lapse at the end of fiscal year 2022-14 2023; provided further that all moneys that are unencumbered as 15 of June 30, 2025, shall lapse as of that date. 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050; 17 provided that section 2 of this Act shall be repealed on 18 19 December 31, 2025.

## Report Title:

Compost Reimbursement Pilot Program; Compost Reimbursement Pilot Program Manager; Report; Appropriation

## Description:

Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a three-year compost reimbursement pilot program to provide reimbursements to farmers and ranchers who purchase compost from a certified processor, dealer, retailer, or wholesaler licensed to do business in the State. Establishes a temporary compost reimbursement pilot program manager position. Requires the Department to submit a report to the Legislature. Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
