A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a single 2 general permit for all prospective food waste composters that is
- 3 designed to handle all potential applicants ranging from small-
- 4 to large-scale operations. Potential small-scale food waste
- 5 composters have indicated that the application process is too
- 6 daunting, deterring them from applying. As a result, the State
- has lost a valuable opportunity to reduce the amount of waste 7
- 8 that enters landfills, create economic benefits for composters,
- 9 and increase the supply of local organic soil enhancers for
- 10 Hawaii's agricultural and horticultural industries.
- The legislature further finds that the solid and hazardous 11
- 12 waste branch of the department of health had intended to develop
- an additional, simplified application process for its general 13
- 14 permit targeting small-scale composters of green waste and food
- 15 waste to encourage more small-scale composters to apply for
- 16 The simplified process would have increased the
- 17 workload on the solid and hazardous waste branch to provide

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- 1 education to prospective applicants, process applications,
- 2 conduct site inspections, and respond to complaints. However,
- 3 an environmental health specialist position dedicated to these
- 4 types of solid waste facilities was eliminated and the
- 5 responsibilities of that position were absorbed by other
- 6 positions, leaving the solid and hazardous waste branch unable
- 7 to expand services to include the simplified general permit
- 8 application process for small-scale composters.
- 9 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to restore an
- 10 environmental specialist IV position to the solid and hazardous
- 11 waste branch of the department of health.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$55,200 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for an
- 15 environmental specialist IV position for the solid and hazardous
- 16 waste branch of the department of health.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 health for the purposes of this Act.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
