A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY WORKFORCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that to develop a
- 2 thriving information technology workforce, the State must
- 3 improve various aspects of its workforce development programs.
- 4 According to a report titled "Hawaii IT Workforce Needs
- 5 Analysis" published in November 2021 by SMS Research and
- 6 Marketing Services, Inc., one of the fundamental components in
- 7 building a robust workforce is the collection of relevant data
- 8 that will enable better evaluation of available programs and
- 9 contribute to better planning for the future.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 11 department of labor and industrial relations to track and report
- 12 data that is necessary to establish a prosperous information
- 13 technology workforce in Hawaii.
- 14 SECTION 2. The department of labor and industrial
- 15 relations shall:

11			info	rmation technology issued in Hawaii,	
12			incl	uding:	
13			(i)	The category or type of certifications and	
14				licenses; and	
15			(ii)	The number of certificates and licenses	
16				issued each year by category or type; and	
17		(D)	Curr	ent information on the individuals who	
18			comp	leted the courses, training, or programs, or	
19			obta	ined the certificates or licenses, including:	
20			(i)	Their occupation;	
21			(ii)	The industry they work in, and	

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1	(iii) The state or country they currently reside;

3	(2) Evaluate the collected data and develop a strategy to				
4	provide better information technology training to				
5	individuals and retain them in Hawaii to build a				
6	flourishing information technology workforce in				
7	Hawaii.				
8	SECTION 3. The department of labor and industrial				
9	relations shall submit a report of its findings and				
10	recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the				
11	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of				
12	the regular session of 2023.				
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
