A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the conservation and
- 2 resources enforcement program of the department of land and
- 3 natural resources shoulders responsibilities that are integral
- 4 to preserving the public peace and safety. Specifically, the
- 5 program is responsible for enforcing laws on public lands and
- 6 waters of the State.
- 7 The legislature recognizes that proper training, equipment,
- 8 and organizational support are imperative to the success of law
- 9 enforcement officers in the conservation and resources
- 10 enforcement program. To this end, the department of land and
- 11 natural resources division of conservation and resources
- 12 enforcement established an academy to better train law
- 13 enforcement officers.
- 14 The legislature further finds that the Commission on
- 15 Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc., created in
- 16 1979, serves as a law enforcement credentialing authority
- 17 through collaboration with law enforcement executive

- 1 associations. Both Honolulu and Maui police departments are
- 2 accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law
- 3 Enforcement Agencies, Inc., and the sheriff division of the
- 4 department of public safety is required to obtain certification
- 5 pursuant to section 353C-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 6 The legislature further recognizes that the conservation
- 7 and resources enforcement program was previously required to
- 8 obtain some certification from the Commission on Accreditation
- 9 for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. As recently as last year,
- 10 the conservation and resources enforcement program was required
- 11 to obtain certification from the Commission on Accreditation for
- 12 Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc., in the use of electric guns, but
- 13 Act 183, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, inadvertently repealed
- 14 that requirement established in section 134-16(f), Hawaii
- 15 Revised Statutes.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 17 land and natural resources to seek and obtain accreditation for
- 18 the conservation and resources enforcement program from the
- 19 Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 199, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§199- Accreditation required. No later than June 30,
5	2025, the department of land and natural resources shall pursue
6	and obtain accreditation for the conservation and resources
7	enforcement program from the Commission on Accreditation for Lav
8	Enforcement Agencies, Inc."
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
11	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
12	department of land and natural resources to pursue and obtain
13	accreditation for the conservation and resources enforcement
14	program from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement
15	Agencies, Inc.
16	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
18	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
