A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BEACHES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 226-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) To achieve the land-based, shoreline, and marine
4 resources objectives, it shall be the policy of this State to:

5 (1) Exercise an overall conservation ethic in the use of
6 Hawaii's natural resources~~[-]~~;

7 (2) Ensure compatibility between land-based and water-
8 based activities and natural resources and ecological
9 systems~~[-]~~;

10 (3) Take into account the physical attributes of areas
11 when planning and designing activities and
12 facilities~~[-]~~;

13 (4) Manage natural resources and environs to encourage
14 their beneficial and multiple use without generating
15 costly or irreparable environmental damage~~[-]~~;




- (5) Consider multiple uses in watershed areas, provided such uses do not detrimentally affect water quality and recharge functions~~[]~~;
- (6) Encourage the protection of rare or endangered plant and animal species and habitats native to Hawaii~~[]~~;
- (7) Provide public incentives that encourage private actions to protect significant natural resources from degradation or unnecessary depletion~~[]~~;
- (8) Pursue compatible relationships among activities, facilities, and natural resources~~[]~~;
- (9) Promote increased accessibility and prudent use of inland and shoreline areas for public recreational, educational, and scientific purposes~~[]~~; and
- (10) Develop a statewide beach assessment study and restoration and conservation plan to regularly assess shoreline erosion and develop feasible restoration or conservation options."

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
