A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that during challenging

2 economic times, it is necessary for the State to investigate and

3 employ digital technology and other innovative ways of

4 maintaining and improving state services and infrastructure,

5 ensure input by stakeholders, and ensure the prudent and

6 cost-effective expenditure of public moneys.

7 The legislature further finds that the state procurement

8 office is responsible for reviewing the solicitation, award, and

9 administration of contracts, advising government agencies on

10 procurement issues, and providing procurement training to the

11 State's decentralized procurement staff. The state procurement

12 office administers statewide, multi-agency contracts that take

advantage of the State's aggregated purchasing power to leverage

better pricing and value for the State and the counties. In

15 fiscal year 2018-2019, these contracts saved the State of Hawaii

16 and its political subdivisions approximately \$19,000,000 in

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- 1 goods and services, plus savings in personnel, purchasing, and
- 2 subject matter expert hours.
- 3 The legislature additionally finds that government
- 4 purchasing offices for several states operate using a
- 5 self-funded model derived from a transaction fee ranging from
- 6 one per cent to two-and-a-half per cent charged to all contracts
- 7 in their respective procurement automation systems.
- 8 Beginning in fiscal year 2022-2023, this Act authorizes the
- 9 Hawaii state procurement office to assess all vendors a
- 10 transaction fee not to exceed two-and-a-half per cent on each
- 11 order the vendor receives on the procurement automation systems.
- 12 This transaction fee will be used to pay for the development,
- 13 implementation, legacy transition, maintenance, system training,
- 14 configuration, and management of procurement automation systems.
- 15 To manage the systems, the state procurement office requests the
- 16 addition of one position.
- 17 The special committee on State of Hawaii procurement, which
- 18 has been reviewing state procurement policies and procedures,
- 19 informally notified the state procurement office that additional
- 20 oversight over complex procurement issues, such as construction
- 21 procurement for the State, is necessary. To provide adequate

1 quidance and oversight to state and county agencies, the state 2 procurement office will require qualified procurement personnel 3 and thus seeks the addition of four positions. 4 The purpose of this Act is to improve procurement efficiency, minimize risks, and save taxpayer dollars by: 5 6 (1)Defining the term "procurement automation system"; 7 Authorizing the administrator of the state procurement (2) 8 office to develop and administer procurement 9 automation systems and to charge and collect a 10 transaction fee from all vendors using the procurement 11 automation systems to fund the development, 12 implementation, and maintenance of the systems; Creating the state procurement automation system 13 (3) 14 special fund; Amending section 103D-1010, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 15 (4) 16 to conform with the amendment made to section 17 103D-1001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by Act 55, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021; and 18 19 (5) Adding one full-time equivalent (1 FTE) position to 20 manage the procurement automation systems and an 21 additional four full-time equivalent (4 FTE) positions

1	to ensure oversight over state and county procurement
2	and complex procurement issues.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
5	designated and to read as follows:
6	"§103D- State procurement automation system special
7	fund. (a) There is established in the state treasury the state
8	procurement automation system special fund to be administered by
9	the state procurement office, into which shall be deposited:
10	(1) All revenues from the operation of the procurement
11	automation systems, including transaction fees
12	collected from all vendors using the procurement
13	automation systems;
14	(2) Interest earned on money in the state procurement
15	automation system special fund; and
16	(3) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund.
17	(b) Moneys in the state procurement automation system
18	special fund shall be used by the state procurement office for
19	the development, implementation, management, and operation of
20	the procurement automation systems."

1	SECT	ION 3. Section 103D-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	""Pr	ocurement automation system" means an eProcurement,
5	accounting	g-oriented, multi-module, data-based system that
6	integrate	s procurement activities from solicitation to contract
7	managemen	t."
8	SECT	ION 4. Section 103D-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"§10	3D-206 Additional duties of the administrator of the
11	procureme	nt office. In addition to the duties referred to in
12	section 1	03D-205, the administrator shall:
13	(1)	Perform periodic review of the procurement practices
14		and procedures of all governmental bodies, in
15		collaboration with the state procurement policy board
16		for compliance with the procurement code;
17	(2)	Assist, advise, and guide governmental bodies in
18		matters relating to procurement;
19	(3)	Determine corrective actions; provided that if a
20		procurement officer under the jurisdiction of the
21		administrator of the state procurement office or a

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	chief procurement officer of any of the other state
	entities under section 103D-203, fails to comply with
	any determination rendered by the administrator within
	thirty days from the date of the issuance of the
	determination, or longer if permitted by the
	administrator upon request by the procurement officer
	or a chief procurement officer, the procurement
	officer or chief procurement officer shall be subject
	to an administrative fine under section 103D-106, for
	every day of noncompliance;
4)	Develop and administer a statewide procurement
	orientation and training program;
5)	Develop, distribute, and maintain a procurement manual
	for all state procurement officials; [and]
6)	Develop, distribute, and maintain a procurement guide
	for vendors wishing to do business with the State and
	its counties[.];
7)	Develop and administer procurement automation systems;

1	(8) Assess, charge, and collect a transaction fee for the
2	use of the procurement automation systems to cover
3	procurement automation system costs."
4	SECTION 5. Section 103D-1010, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
6	follows:
7	"[+]\$103D-1010[+] Purchases from qualified community
8	rehabilitation programs. (a) Any governmental body, without
9	advertising or calling for bids, may purchase goods or services
10	provided by qualified community rehabilitation programs serving
11	persons with disabilities that have indicated an interest in
12	supplying the goods or services and on an equitable basis may
13	apportion the business among the interested programs; provided
14	that the goods and services meet the specifications and needs of
15	the purchasing agency and are purchased at a fair market price
16	as determined by the appropriate public agency; and provided
17	further that the programs [comply with the following:
18	$\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Meet] meet all of the requirements of a qualified
19	community rehabilitation program under section
20	103D-1001[; and

1	(2) Maintain a disabled to non-disabled employee ratio
2	equal to or in excess of three-to-one for work hours
3	of direct labor at all times on the work contracted].
4	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
5	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
6	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to fund
7	five full-time equivalent (5 FTE) purchasing specialist
8	positions, of which one full-time equivalent (1 FTE) position
9	shall manage the procurement automation system within the state
10	procurement office.
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
12	procurement office for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Procurement; Automation System; Special Fund; Qualified Community Rehabilitation Programs; Appropriation

Description:

Authorizes the State Procurement Administrator to develop and administer procurement automation systems and assess, charge, and collect a transaction fee from all vendors using the procurement automation systems. Establishes the state procurement automation system special fund. Amends section 103D-1010, HRS, to conform with the amendments made to section 103D-1001, HRS, by Act 55, SLH 2021. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
