A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated from the sources of
3 funding indicated below to collective bargaining statewide
4 (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may be
5 necessary to fund for fiscal year 2022-2023 all collective
6 bargaining cost items in the reopener agreement negotiated with
7 the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit (8):

9 compensation plans as those officers and employees within
10 bargaining unit (8):

22 in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is


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1 paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Budget and Finance

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

PURPOSE: To provide appropriations for collective bargaining cost items and other public employment costs for the members of Unit (8) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal year 2022-2023 pursuant to reopener negotiations.

MEANS: By the submittal of a specific appropriation measure.

JUSTIFICATION: Appropriations by the Legislature are necessary to cover the expected cost of implementing the collective bargaining reopener agreement negotiated between the State and the respective bargaining unit representing state public officers and employees for the fiscal biennium that commenced July 1, 2021.

Inasmuch as an agreement with the bargaining unit was not reached in time to include all cost items in the 2021-2023 biennium budget, a separate measure is proposed for submittal to the Legislature.

Impact on the public: "(I)t is the public policy of the State to promote harmonious and cooperative relations between government and its employees and to protect the public by assuring effective and orderly operations of government. These policies are best effectuated by (1) recognizing the right of public employees to organize for the purpose of collective bargaining, (2) requiring the public employers to negotiate with and enter into written agreements with exclusive representatives on matters of wages, hours,

and other conditions of employment, while, at the same time, (3) maintaining merit principles and the principle of equal pay for equal work among state and county employees" (Section 89-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes).

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Pay raise and other negotiated cost items are not included in the departments' operating budget request.
