A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KUPUNA CARE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to improve
- 2 government efficiency by amending part II of chapter 349, Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes, entitled kupuna care and caregiver support
- 4 services, to incorporate the kupuna caregivers program into the
- 5 kupuna care program.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 349-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1. By adding four new definitions to be appropriately
- 9 inserted and to read:
- ""Caregiver" means a spouse, adult child, other relative,
- 11 partner, or friend who has a personal relationship with and
- 12 provides a broad range of unpaid assistance for an older adult
- with a chronic or disabling condition.
- "Caregiver support services" means services that offer
- 15 education, skills, knowledge, mental, emotional, or social
- 16 support to employed caregivers.

1	"Employed caregiver" means an individual who meets the
2	following requirements:
3	(1) Provides care for a care recipient; and
4	(2) Is employed at least twenty hours per week by one or
5	more employers or is self-employed.
6	"Financial management service provider" means an agency
7	under contract with the executive office on aging to act as the
8	fiscal and employer agent on behalf of a care recipient to
9	manage employer-related functions, process payment to employees
10	and vendors, and monitor the care recipient's allocation of
11	funds."
12	2. By amending the definitions of "aging and disability
13	resource centers" and "attendant care", to read:
14	""Aging and disability resource centers" means an entity
15	established by the State as part of the state system of long-
16	term care, serving as a highly visible and trusted source where
17	people of all incomes and ages can [get] obtain information on
18	the full range of long-term support options, and a single point
19	of entry for access to public long-term support programs and
20	benefits.

- 1 "Attendant care" means standby assistance, supervision, or
- 2 cues, including verbal prompts for medication, bathing, eating,
- 3 grooming, and dressing, and may also include other activities to
- 4 help maintain the independence of an individual at home.
- 5 "Attendant care" does not include physical contact in support,
- 6 including but not limited to weight-bearing assistance with
- 7 transfers, washing, bathing, and dressing."
- 8 3. By amending the definitions of "case management" and
- 9 "coach" to read:
- 10 ""Case management" means assistance either in the form of
- 11 access or care coordination in circumstances where an individual
- 12 is experiencing diminished functioning capacities, personal
- 13 conditions, or other characteristics that require the provision
- 14 of services by formal service providers, caregivers, or [family]
- 15 employed caregivers. Activities of case management may include
- 16 assessing needs, developing care plans, authorizing and
- 17 coordinating services among providers, and providing follow-up
- 18 and reassessment, as required.
- "Coach" means an individual who:
- 20 (1) Helps the care recipient understand the program of
- 21 participant-directed services and support;



(2)	beverops and implements a spending plan to describe

(3)	Evaluates whether the participant-directed service and
	support program is meeting the care recipient's

- 12 6. By amending the definition of "respite care" to read:
- ""Respite care" means services that offer temporary,
- 14 substitute supports, or living arrangements for care recipients
- 15 to provide a brief period of rest to [qualified] employed
- 16 caregivers. "Respite care" includes:
- 17 (1) In-home respite (personal care, homemaker [services],
- and other in-home respite);
- 19 (2) Respite provided by attendance of the care recipient
- 20 at a nonresidential program;

1	(3)	institutional respite provided by placing the care

3		nursing home for a short period of time as a respite

19	SECT	ION 3. Section 349-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended to	read as follows:

1	"§349-17 Kupuna care program. (a) The executive office
2	on aging may establish the kupuna care program. The program
3	shall provide an array of long-term services and supports to
4	address the needs of Hawaii's older adults [and their desire to
5	remain in their own homes and communities as they age.] to age
6	in place and avoid institutionalization and provide support
7	services to caregivers or employed caregivers in their effort to
8	assist older adults to continue residing in their homes.
9	(b) The program shall be coordinated and administered by
10	the executive office on aging and implemented through the area
11	agencies on aging.
12	(c) To qualify for the kupuna care program, an individual
13	shall be a care recipient, caregiver, or employed caregiver as
14	defined in section 349-16.
15	(d) An area agency on aging, through the aging and
16	disability resource center or other entity designated by the
17	executive office on aging, shall determine eligibility for the
18	program, which may include the following:
19	(1) An intake process to preliminarily determine
20	eligibility for publicly-funded services and supports,
21	including kupuna care services;

Ţ	(2)	A comprehensive in-nome assessment of the care
2		recipient or a caregiver assessment, if necessary; and
3	(3)	A written individualized person-centered support plan
4		that identifies all the services and supports needed
5		or currently used to meet the needs of the care
6		recipient, caregiver, or employed caregiver, including
7		those provided by other programs such as medicaid or
8		privately paid programs.
9	<u>(e)</u>	An area agency on aging shall use the assessment data
10	and indiv	idual's support plan to confirm kupuna care program
11	eligibili	ty, then authorize and coordinate services and
12	supports.	An area agency on aging shall authorize and allot
13	kupuna ca	re services and shall not delegate the service
14	authoriza	tion function to its subcontractors.
15	[(e)] <u>(f)</u> The kupuna care program shall be delivered
16	through t	wo distinct service options: traditional service
17	delivery	or participant-directed services and support, based on
18	an [indiv	idual] individualized, person-centered support plan for

1	(1)	Traditional service delivery shall be a service
2		provider [organization or person who provides services

8		in the care recipient's person centered support plan;

12		aging or area agency on aging; and
13	(2)	Participant-directed services and support shall
14		address the care recipient's assessed needs [that have
15		been identified through the person centered planning
16		process and documented in the support plan.
17		Participant directed services and support shall
18		consist of long-term services and supports that a care
19		recipient uses to maintain independence in the
20		community, in which the care recipient determines what
21		mix of services and support will address the care

1	recipient's needs.] through person-centered planning.
2	The care recipient shall have decision-making
3	authority over[the care recipient's budgeted dollar
4	amount] their own budget to purchase and manage [the]
5	their needed services and supports based upon [the
6	care recipient's] their person-centered support plan.
7	[Participant directed services and support shall
8	provide the care recipient with a coach to assist the
9	care recipient with using the services and support in
10	a manner that best supports the care recipient's
11	ability to maintain independence and enable a quality
12	living experience in the community.
13	(d) To qualify for the kupuna care program, an individual
14	shall be a care recipient as defined in section 349-16.
15	(e) An area agency on aging, through the aging and
16	disability resource center or other entity designated by the
17	executive office on aging, shall conduct an intake and
18	assessment of individuals seeking long term services and
19	supports to determine eligibility for the program. The intake
20	and assessment shall include the following:

Ţ	(1)	A Statewide uniform intake process developed with and
2		adopted by the executive office on aging to
3		preliminarily determine eligibility for publicly
4		funded services and supports, including kupuna care
5		services; and
6	(2)	An assessment of the eligible care recipient utilizing
7		a statewide, uniform comprehensive in home assessment,
8		if necessary. Upon completion of the in home
9		assessment, the care recipient develops a written
10		individualized person-centered support plan with:
11		(A) The assistance of a coach in the preparation of
12		the support plan; and
13		(B) Participation from family, friends, and others,
14		if the care recipient desires such additional
15		assistance.
16		The support plan identifies all the services and
17		supports needed or currently used to meet the care
18		recipient's needs, both formal and informal, including
19		those provided by other programs such as medicaid or
20		private paid programs. The plan shall be reviewed

1	with the care recipient to confirm that it is the plan
2	the care recipient desires.
3	(f) An area agency on aging shall use the assessment data
4	and individual's support plan to confirm kupuna care program
5	eligibility, then authorize and coordinate services and
6	supports. An area agency on aging shall directly authorize and
7	allot kupuna care services, and shall not delegate the service
8	authorization function to its subcontractors.]
9	(g) An individual shall be determined to be ineligible for
10	kupuna care services when:
11	(1) An individual does not meet the eligibility
12	requirements specified;
13	(2) An [individual] individual's need is not substantiated
14	through an in-home assessment;
15	(3) An individual leaves the State or the individual's
16	whereabouts are unknown; or
17	(4) An individual refuses services.
18	(h) An area agency on aging shall provide an individual
19	with written notice of the disposition of [the request]
20	ineligibility for kupuna care services.

(i) An individual who has been determined ineligible for 1 2 kupuna care services shall have the opportunity to appeal the decision to the [director of the executive office on aging 3 4 within ninety days after the date of notice of the area agency 5 on aging's written disposition. The director of the executive 6 office on aging's decision on the appeal shall be issued in writing and shall be final.] area agency on aging. 7 (j) Prior to termination of kupuna care services, service 8 9 providers shall notify the [appropriate contracting] area agency 10 on aging of the date and reason for termination. Termination of 11 kupuna care services may occur if the care recipient [+], 12 caregiver, or employed caregiver: 13 Moves and the provider is unable to locate the care 14 recipient [+], caregiver, or employed caregiver; 15 (2) Is transferred to another area agency on aging; 16 (3) Dies; 17 (4)No longer needs or wants kupuna care services and 18 supports, or no longer needs or wants a particular 19 kupuna care service or support; Is uncooperative with the service provider; (5) 20

•	(0)	is noncompitant with the basic requirements of the
2		program;
3	(7)	Engages in behavior that threatens or demonstrates
4		violence toward the service provider;
5	(8)	Is placed or resides in a long-term care facility,
6		such as an intermediate care facility, assisted living
7		facility, skilled nursing facility, hospital,
8		community care foster [eare] family home, adult foster
9		[family] home, adult residential care home, [or]
0		expanded adult residential care home[+], or
11		developmental disabilities domiciliary home;
12	(9)	Uses comparable services from other programs; or
13	(10)	Has a communicable disease that threatens the safety

15	(k)	All area agencies on aging shall record all consumer

18	(1)	The kupuna care program shall award an allocation of
19	funds to	cover costs for services, subject to availability of
20	funding,	provided that the allocated funds shall be issued
21	directly	to the service provider or financial management service

provider upon request and receipt of an invoice for services 1 2 rendered. $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ (m) The director may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 3 91 necessary for the purposes of this section." 4 SECTION 4. Section 349-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 6 repealed. ["\$349-18 Kupuna caregivers program. (a) The executive 7 office on aging may establish the kupuna caregivers program. 8 The program shall provide assistance to a qualified caregiver 9 10 who meets the requirements of this section. (b) The program shall be coordinated and administered by 11 the executive office on aging and implemented through the area 12 agency on aging. The executive office on aging shall develop 13 14 and implement a plan to maximize the number of caregivers served by the program. 15 16 (c) The kupuna caregivers program shall award an allocation of funds, subject to the availability of funding and 17 18 up to a maximum of \$210 per week, to cover costs for services that would otherwise be performed by the qualified caregiver for 19 the care recipient, including but not limited to: 20
