### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows: The selection committee shall rank a minimum of three 3 "(q) 4 persons based on the selection criteria and send the ranking to 5 the head of the purchasing agency. If the purchasing agency 6 fails to receive submissions from a minimum of three qualified 7 persons, the purchasing agency may proceed with two or fewer 8 qualified persons, provided that the purchasing agency 9 determines in writing that it is in the best interests of the 10 State to proceed with fewer than three qualified persons. The 11 contract file shall contain a copy of the summary of 12 qualifications for the ranking of each of the persons provided 13 to the head of the purchasing agency for contract negotiations. 14 If more than one person holds the same qualifications under this 15 section, the selection committee shall rank the persons in a 16 manner that ensures equal distribution of contracts among the 17 persons holding the same qualifications. DEPARTMENT: Transportation

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES.

- PURPOSE: To amend section 103D-304(g), Hawaii Revised Statutes, procurement of professional services, to allow procurement of professional services where there are fewer than three qualified persons.
- MEANS: Amend section 103D-304(g), Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- JUSTIFICATION: The requirement to rank a minimum of three qualified persons based on the selection criteria and send the ranking to the head of the purchasing agency is problematic when fewer than three gualified persons offer submittals. Continuing to solicit in hopes of obtaining three bids causes project delay. The State Procurement Code was established to allow for fairness to the public, to increase public confidence, and to foster broad-based competition, fiscal responsibility, and efficiency in the procurement process. Allowing the purchasing agency to proceed when there are fewer than three qualified persons and the purchasing agency has made a written determination that it is in the best interests of the State to proceed with fewer than three qualified persons, will expedite the procurement process.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> Timely delivery of public works projects after procurement and award.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Reduced project delays, funding lapses, and project cost increases.
