## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS CANDIDATE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;
4	meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the
5	general management and control of the board of regents. The
6	board shall consist of eleven members who shall be appointed by
7	the governor [from lists of qualified candidates presented to
8	the governor by the candidate advisory council, pursuant to
9	section 304A-104.6,] and shall be confirmed by the senate $[;$
10	provided that if the list of qualified candidates includes fewer
11	than three candidates at any time during the nomination and
12	confirmation process, the governor may request that the
13	candidate advisory council reopen recruitment for qualified
14	candidates]. Members may be removed by the governor. Except as
15	otherwise provided by law, state officers shall be eligible for
16	appointment and membership.

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1 The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided 2 3 that the term of the student member shall be two years. Every 4 member may serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term 5 of appointment as a holdover member until the member's successor 6 has been appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate 7 in accordance with article X, section 6 of the Hawaii State 8 Constitution; provided that, notwithstanding any law to the 9 contrary, a holdover member shall not serve as a member of the 10 board beyond the end of the first regular session of the 11 legislature following the expiration of the member's term. 12 Members shall serve no more than two consecutive five-year 13 terms; provided that the members who are initially appointed to 14 terms of two years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to 15 16 be appointed to a second term of five years, the senate shall 17 consider the question of whether to reconfirm the member at 18 least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of a 19 member's first five-year term; provided that if the senate is 20 not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the 21 conclusion of the member's first five-year term, the member

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shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for the next
 regular session or the next special session for which the senate
 is authorized to consider the question of reconfirmation.

In determining whether to confirm the governor's 4 (b) nominee to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the 5 6 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will 7 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of 8 9 the university system and assist the university system in achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators. 10 The 11 senate shall consider whether the board reflects the diversity of the student population, the various counties of the State, 12 13 and a broad representation of higher education-related 14 stakeholders.

(c) At its first meeting after June 30 of each year, the board of regents shall elect a chairperson and one or more vicechairpersons who shall serve until the adjournment of the first meeting of the board of regents after June 30 of the next year, or thereafter until their successors are elected; provided that the chairperson and vice chairpersons shall not be elected prior to the taking of office of regents whose terms shall begin on

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1 July 1 of that year. The board shall appoint a secretary, who 2 shall not be a member of the board. The president of the 3 university shall act as executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of regents shall constitute a quorum to 4 5 conduct business, and the concurrence of a majority of all the 6 members to which the board of regents is entitled shall be 7 necessary to make any action of the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten times annually and, from time to 8 9 time, may meet in each of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and 10 Kauai.

11 [(d) The governor shall notify the candidate advisory 12 council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii in 13 writing within ten days of receiving notification that a member 14 of the board of regents is resigning or has died, or is being 15 removed by the governor.

16 (e)] (d) The members of the board of regents shall serve
17 without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
18 within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
19 actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
20 SECTION 2. Section 304A-104.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 repealed.

5		vacant seat on the board of regents of the University

7	<del>.(c)</del>	-The candidate advisory council shall initiate the
8	recruitme	ent and evaluation of candidates for each vacancy on the
9	<del>board of</del>	regents within:
10	<del>(1)</del>	Sixty days of a vacancy; or
11	<del>(2)</del>	At least one hundred twenty days prior to the
12		expiration of a regent's term.
13	<del>(d)</del>	To provide-continuity for the board of regents, the
14	<del>governor</del>	may recommend to the candidate advisory council the
15	<del>reappoint</del>	ment of a member of the board of regents, subject to
16	the advie	e and consent of the senate.

4	A member of the Association of Emeritus Regents of the
5	University of Hawaii, appointed by the chair of the Association
6	of Emeritus Regents of the University of Hawaii, shall serve as
7	an ex officio, nonvoting member of the candidate advisory
8	council, for a term not to exceed two years; provided that the
9	appointment shall run concurrently with the term of the
10	appointing chair.
11	The president of the senate, speaker of the house of
12	representatives, and governor are encouraged to appoint full-
13	time students of the university, university faculty, university
14	staff, or-university alumni to the candidate advisory council;
15	provided that if a full-time student is appointed to the
16	candidate advisory council, the student shall have been enrolled
17	as a full-time student for at least three consecutive semesters
18	and shall serve for a term of two years.
19	(f) Voting members of the candidate advisory council shall
20	serve for the following terms:

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1	<del>(1)</del>	Those appointed by the president of the senate and
2		speaker of the house of representatives shall serve
3		for a term of four years; and
4	<del>(2)</del>	Those appointed by the governor shall serve for a term
5		of four years; provided that such appointments shall
6		run concurrently with the term of the appointing
7		<del>governor.</del>
8	- <del>(g)</del>	Appointees to the candidate advisory council shall
9	<del>have a ge</del>	neral-understanding of the purposes of higher
10	education	,-the mission and strategic goals-of the University of
11	<del>Hawaii sy</del>	stem, and the role and responsibilities of the board of
12	regents.	Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed
13	<del>as having</del>	-placed-the broad public interest ahead of special
14	interests	, are respected by the community, and are highly

17	<del>(h)</del>	Any member of the candidate advisory council whose

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1	(i) A vacancy occurring in the membership of the candidate
2	advisory council during a term shall be filled for the remainder
3	of the unexpired term thereof by the appointing authority who
4	appointed the member who creates the vacancy.
5	(j) The candidate advisory council shall operate in a
6	wholly nonpartisan manner. No member of the candidate advisory
7	council shall run for or hold any elected office of the State or
8	any of its political subdivisions while serving on the candidate
9	advisory council. A member of the candidate advisory council
10	shall resign from the candidate advisory council prior to filing
11	nomination papers for an elected office of the State or any of
12	its political subdivisions.
13	(k) The chairperson of the candidate advisory council
14	shall be elected by a majority of the voting members of the
15	candidate advisory council. A majority of the members to which
16	the candidate advisory council is entitled shall constitute a
17	quorum to conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of
18	the voting members of the candidate advisory council shall be
19	necessary to make any action of the candidate advisory council
20	valid. The candidate advisory council shall meet annually and

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1	at other times as necessary. The candidate advisory council
2	shall be exempt from part I of chapter 92.
3	(1) Members of the candidate advisory council shall serve
4	without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
5	including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
6	their duties."]
7	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
10	and upon ratification of a constitutional amendment repealing
11	the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the
12	University of Hawaii.
