A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE PRECEPTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a shortage 2 of primary care providers in the State, which will be 3 exacerbated by the projected retirements of current physicians, 4 advanced practice registered nurses, and pharmacists. Training 5 for primary care requires precepting experiences with both 6 primary care providers and specialist providers. Although 7 students from Hawaii are interested in pursuing careers in the 8 health care service industry in Hawaii, in-state educational 9 institutions are constrained by the lack of clinical education 10 sites in Hawaii and limited supply of qualified preceptors. One 11 way to encourage the participation of preceptors is to offer an 12 income tax credit for health care professionals who serve as 13 preceptors.

14 The purpose of the existing healthcare preceptor income tax 15 credit established under section 235-100.25, Hawaii Revised 16 Statutes, is to incentivize volunteer preceptors to offer 17 professional instruction, training, and supervision to students

1 and residents seeking careers as health care providers. During 2 the first-year implementation of the tax credit, a large number 3 of providers trained eligible students in 2019, but only a small 4 subset met the eligibility requirements due to the primary care 5 qualifying criteria.

6 The legislature further finds that training physicians, 7 advanced practice registered nurses, and pharmacists in primary 8 care requires training from specialties that support primary 9 care, in addition to training from primary care providers. The 10 legislature also finds that the definition of "volunteer-based 11 supervised clinical training rotation" may be clarified to 12 facilitate the preceptor credit assurance committee's 13 implementation of the tax credit.

14 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:

15 (1) Amend the definitions of "preceptor" and "volunteer16 based supervised clinical training rotation" to
17 improve accessibility for providers to receive income
18 tax credits for acting as preceptors; and
19 (2) Revise the membership of the preceptor credit

20 assurance committee to include the director of health.

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1	SECTION 2. Section 235-110.25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
3	"(g) For the purposes of this section:
4	"Academic program" means an academic degree granting
5	program or graduate medical education program that:
6	(1) Holds either its principal accreditation or a physical
7	location in Hawaii; and
8	(2) Provides education to students, of whom more than
9	fifty per cent are residents of Hawaii.
10	"Advanced practice registered nurse student" means an
11	individual participating in a nationally accredited academic
12	program that is for the education of advanced practice
13	registered nurses and recognized by the state board of nursing
14	pursuant to chapter 457.
15	"Eligible professional degree or training certificate"
16	means a degree or certificate that fulfills a requirement to be
17	a physician or osteopathic physician, pursuant to chapter 453,
18	an advanced practice registered nurse, pursuant to chapter 457,
19	or a pharmacist, pursuant to chapter 461.

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"Eligible student" means an advanced practice registered
 nurse student, medical student, or pharmacy student who is
 enrolled in an academic program.

4 "Medical student" means an individual participating in a 5 nationally accredited academic program leading to the medical 6 doctor or doctor of osteopathy degree. "Medical student" 7 includes graduates from nationally accredited academic programs who have continued their training, in the role of resident or 8 9 fellow, to obtain the additional qualifications needed for 10 medical licensure, pursuant to chapter 453, or specialty 11 certification.

12 "Nationally accredited" means holding an institutional 13 accreditation by name to offer post-secondary medical primary 14 care education. Accreditation for medical students shall be 15 offered by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education or 16 American Osteopathic Association Commission on Osteopathic 17 College Accreditation. Accreditation for advanced practice 18 registered nurse students shall be offered by the Commission on 19 Collegiate Nursing Education.

20 "Pharmacy student" means an individual participating in an
21 academic program that is nationally accredited for the training



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of individuals to become registered pharmacists pursuant to
 chapter 461.

3 "Preceptor" means a physician or osteopathic physician, 4 licensed pursuant to chapter 453, an advanced practice 5 registered nurse, licensed pursuant to chapter 457, or a 6 pharmacist, licensed pursuant to chapter 461, who is a resident 7 of Hawaii [and who], maintains a professional [primary care] 8 practice in this State[-], and whose specialty supports the 9 development and training of an eligible student in primary care. 10 "Primary care" means the principal point of continuing care 11 for patients provided by a healthcare provider, including health 12 promotion, disease prevention, health maintenance, counseling, 13 patient education, diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic 14 illnesses, and coordination of other specialist care that the 15 patient may need.

16 "Volunteer-based supervised clinical training rotation"
17 means [an uncompensated] a period of supervised clinical
18 training [of] to an eligible student that totals at least eighty
19 hours of supervisory time annually, in which a preceptor
20 provides personalized instruction, training, and supervision to
21 an eligible student to enable the eligible student to obtain an

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1	eligible professional degree or training certificate $[-]$;
2	provided that, while a preceptor may be compensated for
3	providing standard clinical services, the preceptor shall be:
4	(1) Uncompensated for the clinical training above or
5	beyond clinical salary or reimbursements for clinical
6	services; or
7	(2) Uncompensated for the provision of clinical training
8	services from tuition funds or from state general
9	funds."
10	SECTION 3. Section 321-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended as follows:
12	1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:
13	"(a) There is established the preceptor credit assurance
14	committee within the department of health. The committee shall
15	develop and implement a plan for certifying healthcare preceptor
16	tax credits under section 235-110.25, including:
17	(1) Developing a process ensuring that requests for credit
18	certification are reviewed and verifications are
19	processed no later than thirty days following the
20	close of each calendar year; and

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1	(2)	Developing the documentation process for the committee
2		to certify a preceptor for the tax credit; provided
3		that the documentation to be collected shall include:
4		(A) The preceptor's name, address, place of practice,
5		and Hawaii provider license number;
6		(B) Dates and hours of volunteer-based supervised
7		clinical training rotation per eligible student;
8		(C) Attestation that the preceptor is uncompensated
9		for the volunteer-based supervised clinical
10		training rotation[; and]; provided that, if the
11		preceptor is compensated for providing standard
12		clinical services, attestation that the preceptor
13		<u>is:</u>
14		(i) Uncompensated for the clinical training
15		above or beyond clinical salary or
16		reimbursements for clinical services; or
17		(ii) Uncompensated for the provision of clinical
18		training services from tuition funds or from
19		state general funds;



1	(D) Itemized specialties that support the development
2	and training of the eligible student in primary
3	care; and
4	[-(D)] (E) Other information deemed necessary by the
5	committee.
6	(b) The committee shall be composed of [representatives]:
7	(1) The director of health or the director's designee; and
8	(2) Representatives of:
9	$\left[\frac{(1)}{(A)}\right]$ The Hawaii/Pacific basin area health education
10	center;
11	$\left[\frac{(2)}{(B)}\right]$ The center for nursing; and
12	$\left[\frac{(3)}{(C)}\right]$ Academic programs with eligible students."
13	2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
14	"(e) As used in this section, "academic program",
15	"eligible student", "preceptor", <u>"primary care",</u> and "volunteer-
16	based supervised clinical training rotation" shall have the same
17	meanings as in section 235-110.25."
18	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022;
 provided that section 2 shall apply to taxable years beginning
 after December 31, 2021.
