## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AMBULANCES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Ensuring access to primary health care on
- 2 Molokai is a challenge for the community. The legislature finds
- 3 that residents of the island of Molokai would greatly benefit
- 4 from the addition of an advanced life support ambulance. The
- 5 legislature also finds that an advanced life support ambulance
- 6 will help reduce death and disability among residents and
- 7 visitors to Molokai by providing timely response to a 911 call
- 8 which is critical to increasing the likelihood of successful
- 9 outcomes for injured or sick individuals.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to purchase
- 11 one advanced life support ambulance to be based on the island of
- 12 Molokai, and related equipment, and pay related personnel costs
- 13 for state-certified emergency medical services personnel.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 17 purchase of one advanced life support ambulance to be based on

- 1 the island of Molokai, related equipment, and pay-related
- personnel costs for one state-certified emergency medical
- 3 technician and one state-certified paramedic.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
