A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that residents in the 2 State must endure the excessive noise that helicopter tours and 3 small aircrafts generate. Federal legislation, such as the 4 National Parks Air Tour Management Act of 2000, established 5 rules that tour operators must follow when flying over national 6 parks like Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, Pearl Harbor National 7 Memorial, and Haleakala National Park. Therefore, it is in the 8 interest of the State to monitor and ensure that federal 9 regulations are being followed and that the State has the option 10 not to renew a tour aircraft operation permit for any company 11 that repeatedly deviates from flight plans over sensitive areas.

12 The legislature further finds that the Federal Aviation 13 Administration, department of transportation, some Hawaii tour 14 helicopter companies, and other interested stakeholders have 15 formed an unofficial Hawaii air noise and safety task force with 16 the stated intent of addressing increasing safety and community 17 disruption concerns, but have been criticized for not fully

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engaging and responding to public concerns in determining
 regulatory or voluntary changes in operations. An increasing
 number of elected officials and community organizations have
 expressed increasing concern with safety risks and community
 disruption arising from tour helicopter and small aircraft
 operations.

7 The purpose of this Act is to require tour aircraft 8 operations to file appropriate reports and disclosures so that 9 the State can monitor their compliance with federal regulations. 10 SECTION 2. Section 261-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12 "(b) Tour aircraft operations. Any other law to the 13 contrary notwithstanding, no tour aircraft operation shall be 14 permitted in any airport under the State's control without 15 having a permit. The director shall adopt rules to regulate 16 tour aircraft operations by permit, which shall include but not 17 be limited to:

18 (1) Identification of the types of aircraft to be19 utilized;

20 (2) The number of operations daily for each type of
21 aircraft used and the days and hours of operation;

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1	(3)	Verification that the applicant is in compliance with
2		all state statutes, including but not limited to this
3		section;
4	(4)	Verification that the applicant has the Federal
5		Aviation Administration certificate 121 or 135;
6	(5)	A written assessment by the department of the impact
7		to the surrounding area and to the subject state
8		airport;
9	(6)	Revocation of a permit based on the failure to comply
10		with the information provided by the applicant and the
11		terms and conditions set forth by the department in
12		the permit; and any false statement or
13		misrepresentation made by the applicant;
14	(7)	Establishment of penalties for revocation and
15		suspension of a permit for failure to comply with
16		permit conditions;
17	(8)	Submission of monthly written reports to the
18		department, which shall be made available to the
19		public, of each tour operation that occurred during
20		the duration of the preceding month, including:

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1	<u>(A)</u>	The date and time that the aircraft took off and		
2		landed;		
3	<u>(B)</u>	The number of individuals aboard the aircraft		
4		during the operation;		
5	<u>(C)</u>	The flight path from takeoff through landing; and		
6	<u>(D)</u>	Whether the aircraft deviated from its intended		
7		flight plan;		
8	[(8)] <u>(9)</u>	Annual renewal of permits; and		
9	[(9)] <u>(10)</u>	Any change of operations under the existing		
10	perm	it to be approved by the director.		
11	No permit	shall be authorized unless accompanied by a		
12	Hawaii sectional aeronautical chart marked to indicate routes			
13	and altitudes to be used in conducting aerial tours and noise			
14	abatement procedures to be employed in the vicinity of			
15	identified noise sensitive areas.			
16	For the p	ourposes of this subsection, "tour aircraft		
17	operations" means any business operation that offers aircraft			
18	for hire by passengers for the purpose of aerial observation of			
19	landmarks and other manmade or natural sites within an island of			
20	the State and for the purpose of transporting passengers for			
21	tourist-related activities."			

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SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
